Ps and 220 K V Receiving Station at Raichur, Raichur has become a very important place in the Karnataka Electricity Board Grid and at present the PLCC Sub Division of Munirabad is looking after the equipments installed at Raichur. The PLCC Sub Division, Munirabad is the only Sub Division which is looking after (1) Munirabad Generating Station Division (2) Bellary 1 and 2 (3) Gangavathi and (4) Raichur and the PLCC Cabinets and exchanges of the above Divisions also are being maintained by the above Division in addition to the Magnete exchange. In view of the above and Raichur being 200 Kms. away from Munirabad and if any faults are developed in the PLCC net work the staff has to be deputed from PLCC Sub Division Munirabad which involves delay in carrying out the work for restoration of communication system and also involves heavy expenditure the Chief Engineer, (General) has preposed for creation of a separate PLCC Sub Division at Raichur with the staff complement as detailed in the proposition statement enclosed at an additional extra cost of Rs.1,62,077/- per Annum.

Proceedings of the Government of Karnataka

Sub : Sanction of Second House Building Advance to Officials in relaxation of Article 211 (a) of KPC. Reg.

Ref : G.O. No. FD 452 AHB 80, dated 2-7-1981

Preamble :

In the G.O. FD 452 AHB 80, dated 2-7-1981, Orders have been issued to sanction IInd House Building Advance in relaxation of provision contained in article 211 (a) of K. F. C. to such of the Government Servants who had been sanctioned House Building Advance, and who were not in a position to complete the construction of their houses, subject to certain conditions specified in the said order.

Government have received representation from the officials for sanction of IInd H.B.A. due to escalation in cost of construction of their houses as was done previously vide G.O. No. FD 452 AHB 80; Dated 2-7-81 and in the light of the decision taken by the Govern-

ment on the recommendations of the Karnataka IIIrd Pay Commission for sanction of enhanced quantum of House Building Advance.

Order No. FD 61 AHB 87, Bangalore, Dated : 29-4-1987.

After careful consideration, the Government are pleased to direct that second House Building Advance may be sanctioned in relaxation of Article 211 (a) of the Karnataka Financial Code, to such of the officials who had drawn the House Building Advance during the period between 1-4-85 to 31-3-87 (24 months) and who are not in a position to complete their houses, subject to the following conditions :

- i) The second HBA is limited to 35% of the 1st Advance already sanctioned by the Sanctioning Authority;
- ii) The amount sanctioned as Second Advance may be disbursed only after obtaining supplementary mortgage deed;
- iii) A Certificate from the Public Works Department, may be obtained to the effect (a) that the construction has been taken up in accordance with the approved plan submitted at the time of sanctioning the first advance and (b) the amount already drawn has been fully utilised on the same and the value of the construction is not less than the amount of advance already drawn. The certificate should also indicate the amount of additional advance required to complete the construction.

- iv) The Second House Building Advance shall carry interest at 10% per annum.
- v) A completion report consequent on the drawal of Second House Building Advance should be submitted to the sanctioning Authority within a period of six months from the date of drawal of amount. If the official fails to submit the report of completion of construction within the stipulated period, he would be liable to refund the entire Second HBA amount in one lumpsum, with interest including penal interest thereon.

2. Heads of Department are requested to furnish to the Secretary to Government, Finance Department, the Particulars with the name of the official, amount required in each case for release of necessary funds for sanction of Second House Building Advance by the Heads of Departments.

3. Necessary amendment to K.F.C. will be issued separately.

In view of there being no provisions under the Board Rules to make such deposits with the Hospital authorities before taking up the surgery, such proposals are not being considered by the Board.... However reimbursement for such medical claims could be made on receipt of the bill directly from the Hospital to the concerned office after treating the patient for the illness.

In the circumstances, all the concerned Officers are hereby instructed not to send any proposal in this regard to the Board and ensure that all such claims are settled at their end itself after the bills for the said treatment are received from the Hospital authorities.

effect from 1-4-69; if the difference between the existing pay and the minimum of the revised scale of an employee was less than the amount representing two times the initial annual increment in the revised scale, he was entitled to service increments at the rate of one increment for every 5 years of uninterrupted qualifying service, subject to a maximum of 3 increments in all or Rs. 25/- whichever is less. This ceiling of Rs. 25/- was enhanced to Rs. 40/- from 1-3-1971. The Labour Court-Bangalore, in its Award dated 25-11-82 on the application No. 83 of 1975, filed by Shri. H. M. Kotraiah and others, has allowed this benefit of service increments in the revised scale with effect from 1-4-69, to the applicants, even though they have not fulfilled the condition that the difference between the existing basic pay and the minimum of the revised scale should be less than 2 times the initial annual increment in the revised scale.

The Board has accepted the above award of the Labour Court. Provisions Act, 1952) to exercise option in the form enclosed vide Annexure I to this order indicating their willingness to come under the Pension and DCRG scheme of KEB or to continue to be governed by the KEB contributory Provident Fund Scheme. The pay drawing officers shall take immediate action to circulate this order and obtain option forms from such employees contributing to KEB Contributory Provident Fund

Scheme and borne on monthly paid pensionable establishment, within sixty days from the date of this Board order in respect of employees absorbed with effect from 1-11-86 and within one month from the date of absorption in other cases. As you are aware, consequent to suspension of two office-bears of KEB Employees Union at Haveri; at the instance of Upa-Lokayukta, agitations including relay fasting, etc ; has been resorted to in various offices of KEB. The following instructions should be followed strictly :

1. Those who resort to hunger strike must take leave.
2. Slogans should be allowed only outside the office hours, i.e., before the office starts, during lunch hour and after the office closes.
3. Nobody should be allowed to make personal accusations against any officers or employees. If this is resorted to, assistance of the Police may be obtained to clear the agitators.
4. In certain cases, it is found that employees have left their work and joined the agitation without applying for leave or without seeking permission. For example, the executive employee, who is on duty from 6 AM ; cannot join the agitation at 10-30 AM. In such cases. the names of such persons should be noted and warning notices have to be issued.

It is learnt that there is a misconception among officers and employees that the suspension has been made without any basis. It is made clear that the investigation has been carried out by the Upa-Lokayukta on their own and at their instance, the employees have been kept under suspension. This position may be explained to all concerned.

Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Life Cover Scheme Regulations, 1987

1. These Regulations shall be called the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Life Cover Scheme Regulations, 1987.
2. These Regulations shall come into force from the date of its notification by the Board.

3. Definitions :

i) **Employee :** Employee for the limited purpose of this scheme means any person who is an employee of the Board including TTR/Casual labourer/ labourers engaged by contractors and the qualifying period for becoming a member of this scheme the employee in question must have put in 60 days of actual service within a period of 3 months or three months of continuous service or date of conformation of his service whichever is earliest.

Note : Employees working in KEB on deputation (foreign service) from other departments are excluded from this scheme.

ii) **Family :** Family means husband/wife/minor children unmrried or widowed daughters and parents wholly dependent on the employee.

Note : "Children" includes legally adopted children also.

4. The scheme will be wholly financed by the Board and no contribution is payable by the employee towards the scheme.
5. **Benefit :** In the event of death while in service of an employee who is covered by this Life Cover Scheme, his nominee/family member shall be paid a sum of Rs. 10,500/-. This will be in addition to the other benefits the employee is entitled to, like Pension, Gratuity etc.
6. **Nomination :**
 - a) An employee who is eligible to be covered under the Scheme shall make a nomination in Form 'A'. All the employees who are in service and are eligible to become members of the scheme on the date of implementation of the scheme shall exercise nomination in Form 'A' within three months from the date of its implementation. In the case of employee who enter into service after the introduction of the scheme, they will be required to make nomination in the prescribed form within three months from the date they become eligible to come under the scheme.
 - b) Nomination shall be in favour of the Wife/husband/Minor Son or daughter unmarried or widowed, daughters, and dependent father or mother, in that order. If subsequent to nomination the employee gets married he/she shall nominate the wife/husband, and the previous nomination shall become null and void.

- c) The pay drawing Officer shall be responsible to obtain the nomination in the prescribed form and paste the same in the Service Register, duly recording an entry under his attestation to the effect of having obtain the nomination and particulars of the nominee.
- d) The employee can change the nomination whenever so required.
- e) If no nomination is made by the employee, the wife/husband shall be eligible to receive the amount. If there is no Wife/husband, payment shall be made to the other members of the family as defined in para 3 (ii) above, in the same order.

7. Payments :

In the event of the death while in service of an employee who is covered under the scheme, his nominee shall be paid the amount admissible under the Scheme after obtaining a claim application in the prescribed form, vide Form 'B'. The amount will be drawn by the pay drawing officer & payment arranged to the nominee after the issue of authorisation by the FA and CAO.

In the case of self drawing Officers who are covered by the scheme, the admissible benefit will be paid by the FA and CAO.

8. The scheme will be administered by the KEB and it is not proposed to create any fund for the same.
9. Separate account for the scheme will be maintained by the FA & CAO., and returns to the Regional PF

Commissioner will be submitted from time to time as desired by him. Facilities for inspection of records/registers by the authorities of the Regional PF Commissioner will also be provided.

10. In event of the Government increasing the maximum amount payable under the Employees Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme 1976, the amount payable under this scheme also shall be revised so that it is not less than the maximum under the Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme.

2. The 'Mergeable Dearness Allowance' worked out at the rates mentioned above shall be rounded off to the nearest ten paise.

3. 'Basic Pay' for the purpose of regulating 'Mergeable Dearness Allowance' with effect from 1-7-86 shall be the Basic Pay in the time scale applicable to the employees. The Mergeable Dearness Allowance shall be variable with reference to increase/decrease in Basic Pay on account of increments, fixation of pay due to promotion/demotion, etc. as the case may be from time to time.

4. The rates of 'Mergeable Dearness Allowance' calculated on the pay stages of the existing Pay Scales of Workmen and Officers of the Board are as shown in Annexure I and II respectively, appended to this Order.

II Pensionary benefits :

1) The Dearness Allowance sanctioned to the Pensioners, including the holders of Family Pension, upto the index level of 632 Points as on 1st July 1986 under Board Order No. KEB/B16/3859/86-87 dt. 5-1-87, shall be merged in their basic Pension. The amount so arrived at after the addition of Dearness Allowance shall be treated as Basic Pension with effect from 1st January 87. The increase in Pension as a result of the merger of Dearness Allowance shall not, however, be admissible for commutation of pension.

2) In the case of a Board Employee who ceases to be in service due to retirement or death while in

1.4 The Orders issued in B.O. No. KEB/B5/614/80-81 dated 23-7-1980 adopting the Government Order No. FD 4 SRP 80 dated 22nd March 80, regarding admissibility of House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance for the Employees who are posted to any place which is situated within a distance of eight Kilo Metres from the periphery of the Municipal Limits of the Bangalore City Corporation and which is not included in the Bangalore Urban Agglomeration Area, but who reside within the limits of Bangalore City Corporation, shall continue to be in force.

1.5 For the purpose of these Orders, the term 'Basic Pay' means pay drawn by a Board Employee in the Scale of Pay applicable to the post held by him and includes :—

- a) Stagnation Increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the Scale of Pay as per the existing provisions of the Board Order ;
- b) Additional Increment if any, granted to him above the maximum of the Scale of Pay, in accordance with the provisions of the Board Order.
- c) Personal Pay, if any, granted to him as per Board Order.
- d) Dearness Allowance Sanctioned as on 1-7-1986 which is treated as Mergeable Dearness Allowance.

"Basic Pay" shall not include any emoluments, other than those specified above.

1.6 House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance are payable with reference to the place of duty, irrespective of the place of residence of a Board Employee.

2.1 A Board Employee will not be eligible for House Rent Allowance, if he is provided with rent free accommodation.

2.2 A Board Employee will not be eligible for House Rent Allowance if his/her spouse has been allowed rent free accommodation at the same Station by the Board/State Government/Central Government/Central or State Public Undertakings/Local Bodies/Semi Government Organisations/Aided Institutions/Co-operative Societies, irrespective whether he/she resides in that accommodation or he/she resides separately in accommodation rented by him/her.

2.3 A Board Employee for whom designated quarters are available, but does not occupy them will not be eligible for House Rent Allowance.

2.4 In the case of a Board Employee whose Basic pay plus Mergeable Dearness Allowance is Rs. 2,525/- per month or more and whose spouse is also an employee of the Board/State Government/Central Government/Central or State Public Undertakings/Local Bodies/Semi-Government Organisations/Aided Institutions/Co-operative Societies and draws Basic Pay (plus Mergeable Dearness Allowance as the case may be) of Rs. 2,525/- per month or more, the House Rent Allowance payable to one of them shall be restricted to

the amount admissible on a Basic Pay (plus Mergeable Dearness Allowance as the case may be) of Rs. 2,525/- per month. The other spouse shall be eligible to draw House Rent Allowance at the prescribed rates.

2.5 Admissibility of House Rent allowance and City Compensatory Allowance during leave, suspension joining time and training shall be regulated in accordance with the provisions of the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations.

3. The rent payable by a Board Employee to whom Board accommodation is available on a rental basis, shall be restricted to 10 percent of his total emoluments or the rent fixed by specific Orders of Board or the House Rent Allowance admissible under this Board Order, whichever is more.

4.1 These Orders shall be applicable to all full time Board Employees who are governed by the provisions of Karnataka Electricity Board Employee Service Regulations and who are on time-scales of pay.

5.1 These Orders shall come into effect from 1st January, 1987.

5.2 The House Rent Allowance and City Compensatory Allowance sanctioned by this Order shall be payable in cash for the month of March 1987 and onwards until further Orders.

5.3 The arrears payable for the month of January and February, 1987 shall be invested in National savings Certificates-VI Issue in multiples of Rs. 50/-

The amount, if any, less than Rs. 50/- remaining after such investment shall be paid to the Board Employees in cash. However, in the case of a Board Employee, who ceases to be in service after 1st January, 1987 but before 1st March, 1987 on account of retirement or death, such arrears shall be payable in cash.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the provision to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Karnataka Civil Services Rules, namely :—

1. Title and Commencement :

- 1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Civil Services (Sixth Amendment) Rules, 1986.
- 2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazzette.

2. Amendment of Rule 135 :

Rule 135 of the Karnataka Civil Services Rules shall be substituted by the following namely :

- 1) A female Govt. Servant may be granted maternity leave by an authority competent to grant leave for a period of 90 days from the date of its commencement. During such period, she shall be paid leave salary equal to the pay drawn immediately before proceeding on leave,

- 2) Maternity leave may also be granted in case of miscarriage or abortion including abortion induced under the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act 1971 (but not threatened abortion), subject to the conditions that—
 - a) the leave does not exceed six weeks ; and
 - b) the application for leave is supported by a medical certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
3. Maternity leave under sub-rule (1) or (2) above shall not be admissible to a female Govt. servant who has two or more living children.
4.
 - a) Maternity leave may be combined with vacation or any other kind of leave. Such leave not exceeding 60 days may be granted without production of medical certificate.
 - b) Leave in further continuation of leave granted under clause (a) of sub rule (4) may be granted in the case of illness of the female Govt. servant subject to production of a medical certificate from the Authorised Medical Attendant. Such leave may also be granted in case of illness of a newly born baby, subject to production of a medical certificate from the Authorised Medical Attendant to the effect that the condition of ailing baby warrants personal attention and that her presence by the baby's side is absolutely necessary.

5. The maternity leave shall not be debited against the leave account.

Selectivity of the procedure to laid down
in Rule 11 of Rule 12 reg.

It has come to the notice of the Board that in a case where disciplinary proceedings were initiated under Rule 11 in connection with the short remittance of Rs. 10/- made to the Bank by a Board employee, the enquiry prolonged for about 12 years ending in the exoneration of the delinquent employee of all the charges made against him. This being a case of

shortage of a small amount of Rs. 10/- the amount spent by the Board for conducting this enquiry was many times more than the amount of shortage involved, apart from the time/labour and energy involved at all levels in finalising the above enquiry. Further the Board observes that it would have served the needs of justice, if disciplinary proceedings under Rule 12 were initiated in the instant case.

Thus, in the disciplinary cases in which charges when held proved justify the imposition of only a minor penalty, the elaborate procedure prescribed in Rule 11, if followed, the disciplinary proceedings get protracted resulting in unnecessary waste of time and labour/money.

Therefore, the Board is of the firm opinion that disciplinary authorities should exercise proper discretion in the selection of procedure, considering the gravity of the charges and the penalties which would be warranted if those charges are ultimately held proved.

All the disciplinary authorities are therefore hereby directed to personally examine the nature of the charges, the evidence on which they are based, consider what penalty would be merited and justified if the charges are ultimately held proved and use proper discretion before selecting the procedure to be followed in the contemplated disciplinary proceedings i.e., either under Rule 11 or 12 or 13 as the case may be.

On account of the delay caused in opening the Ledger Account and serving the first Energy Bill to the consumer and also in failing to intimate a particular consumer of his energy entitlement at the time of servicing his electrical Installation, in one of the subdivisions in Tumkur Circle, the Board had to incur loss of revenue to an extent of Rs. 34, 194-00.

Just as the saying 'little drops make mighty Ocean', gose, if this type of glaring mistakes are not checked at this stage, the financial position of the Board would be in a bad shape.

So, in order to get over this situation, the concerned Officers/Officials of the Divisions/Sub-Divisions of KEB are hereby directed to firstly, **intimate** the consumers of their **energy entitlements**, (fixed as per the prevailing Rules), immediately after servicing the installations without fail) secondly, to send the RR Dockets of the newly serviced installations to the Revenue Section for preferring the first energy bills to the consumers within **20 days** from the date of catering electrical service to them and thirdly, the Revenue section Staff to prefer and send the first energy bills to the consumers invariably within a **month** from the date of such service as envisaged under para 118(8) 'NOTE'

of KEB Accounts Manual Vol. I, failing which, the personnel concerned would be personally held responsible for the likely loss of Revenue that the Board may incur on the above account.

- ii) Installations with Meters, but not recording.

- v) Installations with in-sufficient deposits.
- vi) Delay in opening Ledger Accounts
- vii) Installations under disconnection, but-Meters and Service Mains not removed. &
- viii) L. T. Power Installations remaining not rated by the M. T. Division for a long time.

The above mentioned irregularities are not only very grave in nature, but also would be detrimental to the interests of the Board, if left to linger any longer.

Bangalore Dated 26th Nov. 87

Approval is accorded to permit such of the Engineers of the Board who are desirous of starting an industry in the state of Karnataka to go on extra-ordinary leave without pay and allowances for a continuous period not exceeding 5 years, keeping the lein ot such of the employees subject to the following terms and conditions.

1. The Board will be very selective in granting leave without allowances to the Engineers & reserves right to reject the leave so applied in the interest of Board Service.
2. The Engineer should have put in 10 years of continuous service in KEB.
3. The leave under this scheme is admissible to those who have successfully completed the probationary

period by fulfilling all the conditions stipulated in KEB. R&P Regulations and the leave sanctioned under this scheme shall not be combined with any other leave.

4. The Engineer should have completed the agreement period wherever such condition is stipulated at the time of appointment.
5. The leave under this scheme shall not be applicable to the engineer working on temporary basis/ on contract/on deputation.
6. Before proceeding on leave, the engineer should have cleared all dues payable to the Board.
7. The leave is admissible only to start their own industry by the engineer within the State of Karnataka. The leave is not admissible to take up any employment in any organisation.
In the case of an engineer who avails leave for starting an industry should inform the Board the location with all details viz., amount invested, & the same, name of the industry, manufacturing materials, ownership etc.,
8. There should not be any contemplated enquiry or enquiry pending against the engineer.
9. No. permission will be granted beyond 5 (five) years under any circumstances.
10. If the engineer does not return to duty on expiry of leave of 5 years, his service will stand automatically terminated.

11. Within 5 Years period if the engineer does not succeed in the industrial venture and expressive willingness to resume duty, Board would permit him to resume duty subject to availability of vacancy. The Board shall have right to direct the engineer to await further orders in the matter. The period so spent by the engineer awaiting orders shall not be treated as compulsory waiting period.
12. Before the expiry of the 5 years leave period, the engineer should give his option expressing his willingness to come back to Board or to resign/retire from Board's service with effect from the date. For this purpose he should send a notice atleast six months before the date of expiry of 5 years leave period. In such cases Board reserves the right to accept the request or to direct the engineer to await until a vacancy is available or until further directions.
13. The engineer is not entitled to any benefit like leave salary etc., during the period of his leave under this Scheme. In other words the leave availed under this scheme shall be treated as **Dies-non** for all kinds of service benefits. He shall lose seniority also in the cadre with reference to those who might promoted before he rejoin duty.
14. The leave sanctioning authority for this scheme will be the authority who is sanctioning the extraordinary leave without pay and allowances normally. A report after sanctioning the leave may be sent to the Board.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section-79 (c) of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948, the Karnataka Electricity Board is pleased to further amend the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Service Regulations as hereunder :—

1. Title and Commencement :

- a) These Rules shall be called the KEB Employees' Service (Amendment) Regulations, 1987.
- b) These Rules shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from 17-8-87.

2. Amendment to Regulation 130 of KEBESRs.

The existing Regulation-130 of the KEB Employees' Service Regulations shall be substituted by the following, namely :-

- 1) A female Board Employee may be granted maternity leave by an authority competent to grant leave for a period of 90 days from the date of its commencement. During such period, she shall be paid leave salary equal to the pay drawn immediately before proceeding on leave.
- 2) Maternity leave may also be granted in case of miscarriage or abortion including abortion induced under the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act 1971 (but not threatened abortion), subject to the conditions that
 - a) the leave does not exceed six weeks ;
 - &
 - b) the application for leave is supported by a medical certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- 3) Maternity Leave under Sub-rule-(1) or (2) above shall not be admissible to a female Board Employee who has two or more living children.

- 4) a) Maternity leave may be combined with any other kind of leave. Such leave not exceeding 60 days may be granted without production of Medical Certificate.
- b) Leave in further continuation of leave granted under Clause-(a) of Sub-rule-(4) may be granted in the case of illness of the female Board Employee subject to production of a Medical Certificate from the Authorised Medical Attendant. Such leave may also be granted in case of illness of a newly born baby, subject to production of a Medical Certificate from the Authorised Medical Attendant to the effect that the condition of ailing baby warrants personal attention and that her presence by the baby's side is absolutely necessary.
- 5) The Maternity Leave shall not be debited against the Leave account.

Read :

- Memorandum of Settlement dated 30-12-85 entered into between the Management of Karnataka Electricity Board and the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Union (Regd. No. 659) in the matter of revision of Pay scales with effect from 1-4-85 and other allied matters.
- 2) Board Order No. KEB/B16/9759/I/86-87 dt. 23-5-87 according approval to treat the entire Dearness Allowance admissible on the Basic Pay as on 1-7-86 as per Board Order No. KEB/B16/3825/86-87 dt. 9-12-86 as "Mergeable Dearness Allowance" and reckon the same as part of Pay for purposes of calculation of Pensionary benefits etc.
 - 3) Government Order No. FD 20 SRS 87 (1) dated 17-8-87 revising the Pensionary benefits to Government servants.
 - 4) U. O. Note No. 109 dt. 17-10-87 from the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer, KEB., B'lore.
 - 5) Board Resolution No. 17591 dt. 5-12-87.

Board is pleased to accord approval for the following :

1. Minimum Pension :

The minimum amount of extra-ordinary pension admissible under Regulation 263 of Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations and the following kinds of Pension admissible under the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations shall be enhanced to Rs. 390/- per month :

- i) Superannuation Pension
- ii) Retiring Pension
- iii) Invalid Pension :
- iv) Compensation Pension
- v) Compassionate Allowance.

2. Maximum Pension :

The ceiling on the maximum amount of the various kinds of Pension mentioned in Para-1 above shall be fixed at Rs. 3,450/- per month.

3. Retirement Gratuity/Death Gratuity :

3.1 In the case of a Board Employee who has completed not less than 10 six monthly periods of qualifying service, the amount of Retirement Gratuity payable under the Karnataka Electricity Board Employee's Service Regulations shall be equal to one-fourth of the emoluments for each completed six monthly period of qualifying service, subject to a maximum of $16\frac{1}{2}$ times of the emoluments. The amount of Retirement Gratuity thus calculated shall be subject to a maximum of Rupees One Lakh.

3.2 In the event of death of a Board Employee while in service, the Death Gratuity shall be admissible under the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Service Regulations at the following rates :—

Length of Qualifying service	Rate of Gratuity
i) Less than one year	: Two times of emoluments.
ii) One year or more but less than five years	: Six times of emoluments.
iii) Five years or more but less than 20 years	: Twelve times of emoluments
iv) Twenty years or more	: Half of emoluments for every completed six monthly period of qualifying service subject to a maximum of 33 times of emoluments provided that the amount of Death Gratuity shall in no case exceed Rupees One Lakh.

4. Family pension :

4.1 The rates of Family Pension admissible under Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations shall be revised as follows :—

Emoluments	Rate
i) Not exceeding Rs. 1,500 P.M.	: 30% of emoluments subject to a minimum of Rs. 390/- PM.

- ii) Exceeding Rs. 1,500 : 20% of emoluments but not exceeding Rs. 3,000 PM. subject to a minimum of Rs. 450/- PM.
- iii) Exceeding Rs. 3,000 PM : 15% of emoluments subject to a minimum of Rs. 600/- PM. and a maximum of Rs. 1,250/- PM.

4.2 In the case of a Board Employee who dies while in service after having rendered a qualifying service of not less than Seven years, the Family Pension shall be admissible under the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Service Regulations at an enhanced rate equal to 50 percent of the emoluments last drawn or twice the Family Pension normally admissible, whichever is less, for a period of seven years or till the date on which the Board Employee would have attained the age of 65 years, if he had survived, whichever is earlier.

4.3 In the event of death on or after 1st July 86 of both the father and mother who were Board Employees, the Family Pension payable to minor children under the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Service Regulations shall be subject to a total of Rs. 1,250/-

5. Emoluments :

The term 'Emoluments' for purposes of calculating various retirement and death benefits and Family Pension shall mean the basic pay drawn by the Board Employee plus 'Mergeable Dearness Allowance' as admissible to the basic pay as sanctioned vide Board

Order No. B16/9759/I/86-87 dated 23-5-87 in the scale of pay applicable to the post held by him on the date of retirement/death which may be either regular time scale of pay or the next higher scale of pay as the case may be and shall also include—

- a) stagnation increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the scale of pay ;
- b) additional increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the scale of pay in accordance with the existing provisions ;
- c) personal pay, if any, granted to him ;
- d) special pay attached to all posts in the cadre i.e. Senior Personal Assistance, Junior Personal Assistants, Typists, Drivers and Lift Attenders.

6. Restoration of Commuted portion of Pension :

In the case of a Board Employee who commutes a portion of his pension under Regulation 256 of Karnataka Electricity Board Employees' Service Regulations, the commuted portion of his pension shall be restored after 15 years from the date of commutation.

7. Date of effect :

7.1 These Orders shall apply to Board Employees who retire from service after 1st July 1986 or die while in service on or after 1st July 1986.

7.2 The Orders contained in Para-1 above regarding Minimum Pension shall be effective from 1st July

1986, the monetary benefit of the increase shall, however, be admissible from 1st July 1987.

7.3 The Orders contained in Para 2 and 3 relating to Maximum Pension and Retirement Gratuity/Death Gratuity will be effective from 1st July 1986. The monetary benefit of Maximum Pension would be available from 1st January 1987 or from the date of retirement, whichever is later. The monetary benefit of Retirement/Death Gratuity would be available from 1st July 1986 or from the date of retirement/death, as the case may be.

7.4 The Orders contained in Para-4 relating to Family Pension shall be effective from 1st July 86 and shall also apply to Board Employees, who retire from service after 1st July 86 and die thereafter. The monetary benefit of the increase shall, however, be effective from 1st July 87.

7.5 The Orders contained in Para-6 above shall, however, be applicable to all the existing Pensioners, who have commuted their Pension before 1st July 86 as well as to those retiring on or after 1st July 86.

8. The existing provisions in the Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations and other Orders issued on the subject from time to time stand modified to the above extent. The other conditions regulating pension, Gratuity, Family Pension and Commutation of Pension shall continue to apply. Necessary amendments to the Karnataka Electricity

Board Employees Service Regulations will be issued separately.

9. Separate Orders have been issued in respect of Employees who retired/died before 1st July 86.

2. The benefit of increase in Pension/Family Pension under Para-1(b) (i) and (ii) above shall be admissible to the Board Employees who have retired or died while in service before 19th July 85. The increase in Pension/Family Pension as per Para 1(b) (i) and (ii) shall not be admissible to the Board Employees who have retired/died while in service on or after 19th July 1985.

3. The increase in Pension/Family Pension sanctioned under this order shall be added to the 'basic Pension' arrived at in accordance with the Orders contained in Para II of B. O. No. KEB/B16/9759/I/86-87 dt. 23-5-87 with effect from 1st July 87. The amount so arrived at after addition of increase shall be treated as "basic Pension".

4. The Dearness Allowance sanctioned to the Pensioners under the revised DA formula with effect from 1st January 87 under B.O. No. B16/7503/87-88 dt. 7-7-87 shall continue to be shown as a separate element.

5. A ready reckoner showing the Basic Pension as on 18th July 85, DA admissible on such Pension at the index level of 632 points as on 1st July 86 and the increase in Pension admissible from 1st July 87 is appended as Annex to this Order.

From a close study of the court decisions in majority of the cases of theft of electrical energy booked at the instance of the local officers of the Board, against the accused persons, it is observed that, the reason for the failure on the part of the prosecution to bring home the guilt of the accused persons in such theft cases, is attributable mainly to the slackness of the Board personnel concerned in so far as the follow up action is concerned.

So, it is felt very necessary that, some sort of a remedial measure is evolved in order to contain the lapses/omission and commission on the part of the Board personnel concerned, which ultimately would go a long way in safeguarding the interests of the Board.

In order to achieve this goal, all the Board Officers/Officials concerned are here by requested to strictly adhere in future to the guidelines among others, as set out hereunder,

- a) The Board Officers/Officials concerned shall see that in all the cases of theft of electrical energy, only the right persons connected with the theft are brought to book
- b) No Board Officer/Official concerned shall turn hostile while adducing evidence in the court, leading to the acquittal of the accused. When and wherever such instances come to the fore, the concerned Officer/Official shall be departmentally proceeded against for attempting to weaken the prosecution case.
- c) The Board personnel concerned shall by & large assist and guide the local police authorities in a proper manner in seizing all the relevant incriminating articles, relating to the theft a energy case for being placed before the court as exhibits and thus strengthen the prosecution case.
- d) The Board personnel concerned shall command complete knowledge of the legal cases they are dealing with and besides they shall invariably be alert and prompt right from the time of registering police complaint against the accused persons, till they complete adducing evidence, in the court as prosecution -witnesses.
- e) The Board personnel concerned shall see that, all the necessary records/exhibits etc. required in the case are produced before the court without fail.

- f) The Board personnel concerned shall pursue the legal cases quite vigorously and with promptitude, till finality.

It has come to the notice of the Board that, while hearing the Appeals of the consumers, against whom theft of energy cases are booked by the Vigilance/Technical Audit Cell, some of the Appellate Authorities in the Board are approving reconnection of the Installations of the consumers accused of committing theft of energy on payment of less than 50% of the back billing charges preferred by the former.

In this connection, I am directed to state that, when and wherever the consumers aggrieved against on order of assesment of back billing charges made by the

Vigilance/Technical Audit Cell/M. T. Staff/O&M Staff etc. the following procedure shall be followed in the interest of Board service.

Normally, before arranging reconnection of the Installations which are disconnected for theft of energy, 50% down payment of back billing charges claimed by the team referred to above, may be insisted upon from such consumers, by the Appellate Authorities concerned, if the former represent in the matter. However, the Appellate Authorities concerned may refer all such cases, where is intended to reconnect the Installations on payment of less than 50% of the back billing charges, to the Board for a decision in the matter, on a case to case basis.

Nevertheless, the Appeals may be heard and finalised by the concerned authorities on payment of not less than 50% of the back billing charges or such other lesser amount as may be ordered by the Board in individual cases.

**Sub : Damages/Theft of Board Materials
Result of Police Investigation-Reg.**

I am directed to state that, whenever the theft of Board materials is noticed, the common practice among the Divisional and Sub-divisional Officers has been to lodge a complaint with the jurisdictional Police Authorities and forward a report in the matter to the concerned Superintending Engineer, Elecl./Zonal Chief Engineer, Elecl./Chief Engineer, Elecy., (Genl.) or the

Board, as the case may be and be done with it, till the Police Authorities themselves report about the detection or otherwise of the theft cases booked with them by our staff:

Quite understandably, the Board has been prevailing upon you all along, in endeavouring to obtain the information about the status/outcome of the Police Investigation in respect of the theft cases pending before the respective Police Stations, for information.

Moreover, it is surmised that the Police Authorities concerned are not being regularly pursued by you to ascertain the progress achieved by them in detecting the cases of theft of Board Materials and in apprehending the culprits, which is conspicuous by the absence of correspondance in that behalf from your end.

In view of the increase in the number of thefts of Board Materials occurring all over the State, as is evident from the statistics on hand, resulting in heavy loss of revenue to Board, I am directed to request you to bestow personal interest in chalking out measures to prevent the occurrence of theft of Board Materials in your jurisdiction as far as possible and whenever the cases of theft of Materials come to your notice, please ensure that a Police Complaint is lodged with the jurisdictional Police Authorities immediately for investigation and the latter pursued till the cases are finally disposed off. If the cases of theft are not closely followed-up, obviously, the Board's interest will be at stake.

I am therefore directed to request you to monitor on a close footing the progress achieved by the Police Authorities in detecting the cases of theft of Board Materials through constant persuasion and intimate the Board as to the status/outcome of such Police Investigation, for information and further necessary action.

However, the status of the Police Investigation, in relation to the complaints lodged with the various Police Authorities in your Division during the years 1986-87 and 1987-88, may be furnished to this Office immediately in the prescribed proforma enclose to this letter, for placing it before the Board for review.

ii) Addendum No. KEB/B16/7747/87-88 dated 28-3-1988.

According to para 6 of the Board Order No. KEB/B16/7747/I/87-88 dated 11-12-87 the commuted portion of pension in respect of a retired Board employee who commutes a portion of his pension under Regulation 256 of KEBESR., shall be restored after 15 years from the date of commutation. This order is applicable to all the existing pensioners who have commuted their pension before 1st July 86 as well as to those retiring on or after 1st July 86. However, the pensioners who have already commuted a portion of their pension before the issue of the Board Order No. KEB/B16/7747/I/87-88 dated 11-12-87 have been given an option to get the benefit of restoration of commuted portion of pension after 14 years from the date of commutation or on attaining the age of 70 years, whichever is later, if it is adventegeous to them.

2. Some doubts have been expressed as to whether

a retired Board employee who had commuted a portion of his pension and had fulfilled the conditions of completion of 14 years from the date of commutation and had attained the age of 70 years prior to 1st August 1980 could claim the benefit of restoration of the commuted portion of his pension earlier to 1st August 1980.

3. The scheme of restoration of the commuted portion of pension was introduced from 1st August 1980 and hence this benefit is not admissible earlier to 1st August 80. A retired Board employee who had commuted a portion of his pension prior to 17th August 87 may, if it is advantageous to him get the benefit of restoration of the commuted portion of pension after 14 years from the date of commutation or on attaining the age of 70 years or from 1st August 1980 whichever is later.

You are aware that Board is procuring large quantities of CSP Transformers from M/s. Kavika even though the rates are higher compared to the conventional

transformers in order to see that the failure rate of transformers are reduced. These CSP Transformers are already allocated to various Divisions.

It is desired by the Board to analyse the performance of these CSP Transformers which are installed so far. Unless a feed back is received from the Field Staff regarding their performance it is difficult to programme the future procurement.

It is brought to the notice of the Board that in Athani Sub-Division, four IP sets of each 10 HP capacity assigning different R.R. Nos. with a common delivery pipe have been serviced to pump water from Krishna river to a open well. Again from this open well which is situated at 6,000 ft. from the river, 3 Nos. of each 10 HP pumpsets assigning different R.R. Nos. with a common delivery pipe of length 5000 ft. have been serviced to irrigate 250 Acres of land. No energy meter is provided to assess the consumption of irrigation pumpsets and the installations are billed at flat rate of Rs. 75/- per HP per annum. The loss of revenue estimated is about Rs. 20,000/- per annum.

In this connection, I am directed to state that when the total capacity of pumpsets installed in a common well is above 10 HP, a common energy meter should be installed for the above pumpsets. Servicing similar scheme as explained above having more than one pumpset of 10 HP assigning individual R.R. No.

Sub : Amendment to Regulation-5 of the KEB Electricity Supply Regulations.

Ref. : Board Notification No. KEB/B11/B10/2195/84-85 dt. 8-5-87.

Regulation-5 of the Karnataka Electricity Board Electricity Supply Regulations has been amended with effect from 8-5-87 as per Notification enclosed.

The major changes in the procedure to be followed for arranging power supply to L.T. Installations due to this Amendment are detailed hereunder for your guidance. The main purpose of the changes in procedure is to reduce the paper work by Assistant Engineer/Junior Engineer's.

1. After receipt of the application, the Assistant Engineer/Junior Engineer of O & M shall inspect the spot for ascertaining the feasibility and necessity of Distribution Line extension if any and also to fix the position of Meter Board and Service Lines. If no line extension is required the service connection estimate shall be prepared in the new format enclosed herewith. If any Distribution Line extension is required, estimate for line extension shall be prepared in the usual form and service connection estimate shall be prepared in the new format.

2. It may be noted that fixed supervision charges have been prescribed depending on the type of service. This will greatly simplify the estimating work.
3. The service connection work will be got done through a licenced electrical Contractor as usual by the consumer including fixing of Meter Board and Sealable Cut outs. However Board will fix Meter, Aerial Board and Cutouts, at its cost.
4. The consumer shall obtain and furnish the road cutting permission in original from the Corporation or Bangalore Development Authority or Local Authority as the case may be, in case of U.G. Cable Service Main, before issue of work Order.
5. There is no refund towards Board's portion of work carried out by the consumer through his Contractor in respect of over head Service Connection for these Installations since supervision charges have been fixed taking into consideration the amount that would have been refunded in the normal course.
6. Where U.G. Cable is used in places specified by the Board, there is a fixed refund of Rs. 250/- for single phase and Rs. 500/- for three phase service connections, irrespective of the length and size of the service line cable laid by the Contractor.

However, there will be no refund if it is a case of replacement of Service Main due to conversion or Sub-service or additional load.

7. Refund will be by way of adjustment towards Power Supply Bills, along with the first Bill to be issued. Refund adjustment will be done by the Revenue Section, based on the entries in the sanctioned Estimate. Orders of the Division Office is not required for this purpose.
8. No measurements are required for preparation of Service Connection Estimate. However, the length of Service Main shall be recorded by the Engineer servicing the Installation at the time of servicing, in the Estimate cum-Completion Report as per actuals, in two copies ie. copy to be sent to RR Docket and Completion Report.
9. No entries in the Measurement Book are required for refund adjustment, since refund charges are fixed and do not have any relationship with the length of Service Main.
10. Estimate shall be prepared in four sets which shall be used as noted below :

The position of the supply point, main cutout or circuit breakers and the meter shall be so fixed as to permit easy access to the employees of the Board at any time.

- b) The service line works from terminal pole upto meter Board, whether overhead or underground including fixing of Meter Board and sealable cut-outs shall be got done by the consumer through the Contractor. The Contractor shall make use of quality materials-conforming to the relevant I.S.I. as prescribed. Wherever materials with ISI markings are available, the same shall be used.
- c) In Bangalore, Mysore, Mangalore, Hubli-Dharwad Corporation Limits and other places notified by the Board from time to time, the service Main shall be laid by underground Cable only.
- d) If the consumer wishes to have power supply means of underground Cables at any place other than the places specified under Clause-(c), the consumer has to bear the entire cost of service line from the point of tap off. The rectification of any fault in the cable subsequent to servicing of the Installation, shall be got done by the consumer at his cost.
- e) Supervision Charges :- The prospective consumer shall pay supervision charges as indicated below :
- 1) For overhead Service Lines for each Installations :
 - a) Bhagyajyothi Installations -Nil-

In exercise of the powers conferred by sec. 49 and 79(j) of Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Act No. LIV of 1948.), the Karnataka Electricity Board hereby amend the regulation No. 11(A) of KEB. Electricity supply regulations notified vide Notification No. KEB/B10/2040/86-87 dt. 28-10-86 & 4-2-87.

I. Title and Commencement :

- a) These Regulations may be called the Electricity Supply Regulations 1986 (Amendment)
- b) It shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from 28-10-86.

Note : This amendment is not applicable to the consumers availing power supply to the multi-storeyed building(s) or complex (es) for whom the power sanction is already communicated on or before 28-10-86.

Regulation 11 (A) - Power supply to multistoreyed building(s) or commercial complex(es).

In respect of commercial complex(es) requiring 10 or more connections in one premises or multistoreyed building(s) having 3 or more floors including cellar floor, if any, the following provisions shall be applicable.

1. The owner/promotor/occupier of the building(s)/complex(es) shall submit an application form in the prescribed form along with a copy of the sanctioned plan of the building(s)/commercial complex(es) and register the application at the jurisdictional O & M Sub-Division Office. The application fee payable shall be as prescribed for each installation subject to a minimum of Rs. 100/- per premises.

2. On receipt of the application, the sub-divisional officer will assess the ultimate requirement of load as detailed below.

| a) For Domestic installations | At 50 watts per sq. mtr. of the plinth area of the sanctioned plan limited to 3 KW. per AEH installation. |
| b) For Commercial and other type of installations. | At 75 watts per sq. mtr. of the plinth area of the sanctioned plan. |

Note : 1) In case of both types of installations come up in the same premises the wattage requirement shall be assessed separately and added.

3. **Specified load**—The specified load of the premises shall be

- a) in case of new constructions the power applied for by the consumer or the assessed load as detailed above whichever is higher.

- b) in case of existing building(s) having power supply before 28-10-86 and coming under the purview of this regulation, when additional/fresh power supply is sought for, either to the existing building or addition to the existing building, the existing sanctioned load or the assessed load as detailed in clause 2 above whichever is higher.

Note : 1) The requisitioned load in case of AEH installation shall be computed on the basis of 3 KWs per installation or on actuals when restrictions on AEH connection is relaxed.

- 2) In case the sanctioned plan indicates two or more multistoreyed building (s) in the same premises, they shall be clubbed together to assess the specified load.

4. Where the specified load is more than 75 KW. the consumer has to avail HT power supply by installing his own transformer and follow the prescribed procedure under HT power supply.

5. If the consumer desires to avail LT power supply the same will be arranged subject to payment of Rs. 750/- per KW. or part thereof of the specified load in excess of 75 KW. as service charges.

In case of new constructions, the amount to be paid shall be on the basis of the specified load for the entire premises as per the sanctioned plan. Where the consumer wishes to take up the construction in stages, he will be permitted to pay the service charges for the portion

which is to be constructed immediately subject to the condition that the consumer gives an undertaking to the Board that he will pay the service charges for the balance portion of the building that would be constructed later at the time of applying for power supply for such portion of the building.

In such cases the consumer has to bear the entire cost of alterations to the service mains if any in arranging power supply to the multistoreyed building(s) or commercial complex(es).

6. In a multistoreyed building (s) or commercial complex (es) already having LT power supply on or before 28-10-86, whenever additional power supply is to be sanctioned on LT basis, service charges of Rs. 750/- per KW. shall be paid as noted below.

- a) **Existing building (s) with additions to plinth area.**
 - i) In case the specified load of the existing building is less than 75 KWs; service charges at Rs. 750/- per KW shall be collected on the assessed load or the load requisitioned for the new construction whichever is higher PLUS specified load of the existing building MINUS 75.KWs.
 - ii) In case the specified load of the existing building is more than 75 KWs. service charges at Rs. 750/- per KW shall be collected on the assessed load of the additional plinth area or the load requisitioned for, whichever is higher.

b) Existing building without addition to the plinth area.

- i) In case the specified load of the existing building is less than 75 KWs. service charges at Rs. 750/- per KW shall be collected on the specified load of the existing building PLUS additional load requisitioned for MINUS 75 KWs.
- ii) In case the specified load of the existing building is more than 75 KWs. service charges at Rs. 750/- per KW shall be collected on the additional load requisitioned.
- c) where the requisition is for additional load to the existing building and fresh power sanction to the additional construction the provisions noted above shall be applied separately and followed.
- d) In the above cases, the consumer shall bear the entire cost of alterations to the service mains, if any.

Note : The requisitioned load, in case of AEH installations shall be computed on the basis of 3 KWs. per installation.

7. If the specified load is more than 25 KWs. the consumer shall provide space in his premises as required by the Board for the installation of Board's transformer and/or switchgear. The space so provided shall have direct access from a public Road and shall be reserved. The Board reserves the right to utilise the space as and when necessity arises.

8. The following additional provisions are applicable when LT power supply is availed for such installations.

- a) Supply to such installations will be a common service cable only.

The consumer shall arrange for laying of the service cable from the nearest distributing main or the transformer in his premises as the case may be at his cost upto the metering point.

He shall also have two cables to have alternate source of supply if the "specified load" is more than 25 KWs. the cable shall be of adequate size and capacity to meet the "specified load". Notwithstanding that the cables are laid by the consumer at his cost the same shall be the property of the Board and will be maintained by the Board after the installation is serviced.

- b) Suitable and easily accessible space shall be provided at the ground floor/cellar floor for housing the Board's metering equipment.

Separate circuit for each installation shall be laid & terminated at the common point of supply. The panel Board and the Bus Bar arrangements shall be as approved by the Board which shall be provided by the consumer at his cost. Metering will be separate for each installation. Typical panel Board and cubicle arrangement is annexed.

- c) At the end of the service line and before the metering cubicle where individual metering equipment is installed a circuit breaker of adequate capacity shall be

installed which shall be actuated by a sensitive Earth Fault Relay/Earth Leakage sensing device. However, such circuit breakers/protection devices may be installed for the individual circuits by the consumer to have better selectivity.

d) The above provisions are also applicable for existing installations in case of additions and/ or alterations in multistoreyed building (s) or commercial complex (es) resulting in 10 or more connections or specified load exceeding the prescribed limits.

10. The above provisions are not applicable to the educational institutions, Government Guest Houses, Government Hospitals, bonafide Hostels and Hospitals run by charitable institutions and multistoreyed building (s) of slum dwellers. However, the consumers of the above category shall avail HT power supply if the sanctioned load is more than 75 KWs.

11. Notwithstanding anything stated any where, if the specified load exceeds 25 KWs. the jurisdictional-Superintending Engineer, Elecl., in-charge of the distribution shall be the competent authority for planning and sanctioning of power supply to such multistoreyed building (s)/commercial complex (es).

12. For servicing such installations other provisions of these regulations as in respect of similar installations shall be applicable.

In modification to the circular cited in reference above, I am directed to communicate approval for adopting the following revised priority norms for servicing of IP sets.

All applications to be grouped under the following groups.

- a) Group 'A' All SC/ST applicants irrespective of type of programme and loan.
- b) Group 'A1' All work orders pending execution in energisation of IP sets for over one year as on 31-3-1987 irrespective of number of poles required for the works (ie., All pending work orders under 'A1' category shall be cleared before taking up the works sanctioned during the current year).

- c) Group 'B' All applicants (other than SC/ST category) coming under "100 wells programme" to be regrouped as 'B1' and 'B2'.
- i) Group 'B1' Works requiring extension of 1 to 5 poles.
- ii) Group 'B2' Works requiring extension of 6 poles and above.

Note : The beneficiaries under '100 wells programme' would be identified by the concerned Block Development Officer of the Block and only those applications supported by a certificate issued by the B. D. O. will come under this classification.

- d) Group 'C' All applicants who are loanees (other than SC/ST category) of KSCARD (PLD.) Bank to be regrouped as 'C1' and 'C2'.
- i) Group 'C1' Work requiring extension of 1 to 5 poles.
- ii) Group 'C2' Work requiring extension of 6 poles and above.

Note : In respect of beneficiaries under PLD Bank loanees requisite certificate would be issued by the concerned KSCARD (PLD) Bank.

- e) Group 'D' All others (other than SC/ST category) and not covered under the above groups to be regrouped as 'D1' and 'D2'.
- i) Group 'D1' Work requiring extension of 1 to 5 poles.
- ii) Group 'D2' Work requiring extension of 6 poles and above.

The revised roster shall be adopted for servicing the I.P. sets coming under group 'B', 'C' and 'D' as follows - after completing & covering Work Orders under Group 'A' & 'A1' above

Regulation 4 (A) – Power Supply to Layouts

In respect of power supply to layouts where distributing mains do not exist, the following provisions shall be applicable.

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions under Regulation 4 (A) or any other regulation, for arranging power supply for any purpose including street lights in the following cases, extension of power supply lines will be deemed as service line extension and the applicant shall pay the entire cost of extension including the cost of distribution transformer and allied equipment if any for taking up the work.
- (i) Residential/Industrial/Commercial layouts formed by Government or Semi-Government bodies, Development Authorities, C.I.T. Boards, Corporations, Municipalities or private parties (Layout duly approved by the competent authority)

NOTE : Any requisition (s) from individual (s) for power supply to domestic lighting or for any other purpose in such layouts will be considered only after laying of power supply lines in the layout.

(b) The applicant is not liable to pay any line minimum charges.

Sub : Presenting claims of Electricity charges in respect of Street Lights and water supply installations of all erstwhile village and Town Panchayats in the state with effect from 1-4-87 regarding.

Consequent on the formation and functioning of Mandal Panchayats and Zilla Parishads with effect from 1-4-87, the following revised procedure in presenting the claims with effect from 1-4-87 and their recovery is introduced until further orders.

1. The Assistant Executive Engineers of accounting units shall render monthly bills in respect of Street Lights and water supply installations (in the same bill form as was presented hitherto) directly to the respective Mandal Panchayats within the stipulated time under acknowledgement. They will have to make payments within 15 days from the date of presentation of bills, as per supply rules.

In case the bills from April 87 to end of August 87 have not been presented till now, they may be presented immediately under acknowledgement and recovery pursued as per Supply Rules. The bills from September 87 and onwards shall also be presented within the stipulated period and the recovery pursued along with the claims from April 87 onwards.

2. The Assistant Executive Engineers, of the accounting units will obtain statements of Demand, Collection and Balance of the street lights and water supply installations from the revenue section every month and contact the Pradhans or Upa-Pradhans concerned and pursue recovery till the entire outstanding amount are paid by the Mandal Panchayats.

3. The Executive Engineers of the respective Divisions shall also be kept informed of the D.C.B. particulars of Electricity charges of these Mandal Panchayats every month, so that the Executive Engineers, could discuss with the President or Chief Secretary of the Zilla Parishads in the K.D.P. Meeting held every month about the non-payment of particular Mandal Panchayats and pursue the recovery through the Zilla Parishads.

4. The Executive Engineers of the Divisions in turn will have to inform the respective Superintending Engineer/Chief Engineer about the progress achieved in respect of these recoveries, so that they too can discuss the position of arrears with the heads of Zilla Parishads during their visit to the various Districts under their jurisdiction.

5. The accounting sub-divisions shall prepare Demand Collection statements of each Mandal Panchayats coming under their jurisdiction in respect of all street lights and water supply installations once in a Quarter and submit them to the respective Divisions. The divisions will consolidate the portion of their entire Division and submit a consolidated statement to the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer, within a month of the expiry of each quarter. The Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer's Office shall forward a consolidate statement to the Board for review, so that the Board can contact the Government and point out the particulars defaulting Zilla Parishads and pursue recovery.

As a result of the acute shortage of power in the State, the financial position of the Board has worsened to a great extent. The projection for the next 6 months will indicate that there will not be enough funds to carryout all the capital works contemplated in 87-88 budget. Therefore whatever little capital that is available to the Board has to be spent in the most judicial manner so as to attain the maximum benefits and also contribute for reduction of system losses.

Therefore it is necessary to review all the IP estimates where the cost per HP exceeds Rs.4,000/- or which requires more than 0.75 KMs. of line per pumpset. in such cases, the investment is high so also losses. Hitherto these estimates were being sanctioned at Executive Engineers, level or at Superintending Engineers level. In future such estimates are to be sanctioned until further orders by the Zonal Chief Engineers,

Elecy., where special attention is to be given towards overloading of transformer and extent of losses etc.

Sub : Package of Incentives and concessions for New Industrial Investments in Karnataka-clarification.

Ref : Board Order of even No. dt. 7-5-84.

As per the Board Order dated 7-5-84, the Executive Engineers of the O & M Divisions are authorised to accord approval for exemption from payment of electricity tax on production of the New Unit Certificate from the Department of Industries and Commerce by the consumers, with the concurrence of the Accounts Officers of the Division.

In this connection, I am directed to state that as per G.O. the tax exemption is allowed for the first three years and five years depending upon the nature of new units industries. It has come to the notice that wrong procedure is being followed by the Divisional Officers while extending the tax benefit as to the period of benefit of tax to be allowed. In some cases, it is noticed that Small Scale units are allowed five years tax exemption instead of three years. Hence, the following procedure is reiterated for guidance.

- a. For Small Scale Industries—for a period of first three years from the date of availment of permanent service.
- b. For Tiny Sector Industries—for the period of first five years from the date of availment of permanent service.
- c. For Medium and Large Industries—for a period of first five years from the date of availment of permanent service in case of LT installations and from the date of availment of power for commercial production in case of HT installations.

Further, you are also requested to produce the following documents to the Chief Electrical Inspector to Government, Bangalore, while seeking clarifications from him on the issue.

1. Copy of New Unit Certificate/SSI Certificate.
2. Registration of Industry Certificate.
3. Date of availment of permanent service by the consumer.
4. Date of availment of power for commercial production in case HT installation.

Sub : Electric Power Tariff 1987-charges leviable for Bhagyajyothi installations

As per the Electric Power Tariff 1987 effective from the first Meter Reading date on or after 2-5-87, the rate applicable in respect of Bhagyajyothi installation is Rs. 2-50 per installation per month under Tariff Schedule LT-1(a).

In this connection it is clarified that this pertains only to the energy charges. Apart from this an amount

of Rs. 2-19 has to be collected towards repayment of 80% of the principal and interest thereon for over 15 years from the date of service. Hence, an amount of Rs. 4.69 rounded off Rs. 4.70 has to be claimed every month in respect of Bhagyajyothi installations.

In accordance with the recently advertised Tariff, these installations are liable for disconnection. However, the arrears due from these consumers may be too heavy for the consumer to pay in one instalment, because this group comes from weaker section of Society.

To avoid undue burden to them, payment in easy instalment may be permitted to the extent the consumer agrees to pay, by the Assistant Executive Engineer, Elecl., of O & M Sub-Divisions themselves. However, these instalments may not be less than Rs. 10/- per month. Whenever such instalments are given the consumer shall be informed that interest is payable on overdue amount from the date of raising demand. The dues shall be worked-out as on July 1987. If any amount has been transferred from Central Office, due credit should be given.

The Government has given some amount to the Board towards Bhagyajyothi expenditure and Financial Adviser & Chief Accounts Officer has transferred these amounts to the Divisions. If such an amount has been received by the Division credit should be given to all Bhagyajyothi on prorata basis and this can be done later if full data is not available.

In the Board Order cited above, instructions were issued to the effect that the Board would levy simple interest at 2% p m. or part of a month, on the arrears of revenue, subject to the conditions specified in that order. It was reiterated in circular letter No. Cys./AOR/Sn.8/Cys.244 dated 26-3-86 of the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer, KEB, that interest should not be charged on the outstanding interest, which would amount to charging compound interest and it would not be correct according to the Supply Regulations in force.

In spite of these instructions, complaints have been received stating that some revenue accounting units are charging interest on the total amount of arrears, including the element of past interest which amounts to charging compound interest in violation of Board Regulations.

I am therefore directed to request you to issue suitable instructions to all the Junior Assistants/

Assistants/Sr. Assistants in-charge of ledger accounts to show principal and interest separately in the opening balance every month and to charge simple interest only on the principal amount, while sending monthly bills to all the consumers.

The Executive Engineers, El.,/Accounts Officers/Asst. Executive Engineers, El., / Asst. Accounts Officers should check the proper compliance of these instructions during their visit to Sub-Divisions/Sections etc., and take appropriate action for any deviation or lapse in this regard, so as to avoid complaints from the consumers in future.

It is also desired that the position and status of metering of DC & MNR installations in general, should invariably be reviewed in the monthly meetings of officers both at the Divisional and Circle levels, in view of the importance required to be attached to this issue.

As you are aware, most of the consumer complaints arise out of the Supplemental claims raised on the basis of audit reports, vigilance reports and such other things.

Strict instructions have already been given that the details of supplemental claims should be given in a separate sheet for which forms have already been

evolved. Invariably this sheet should be appended to the normal bill to enable the consumer to know the basis and the details of the claims made by the Board. This is the fundamental duty of the Board. If any lapses are found in not appending the details immediate action should be taken against those people by considering such lapses as dereliction of duty.

Whenever a supplemental claims is a large amount in comparison with the normal bill i.e., if the supplemental claim is more than twice the usual bill, such supplemental claims should be verified and attested by the AAO and the AEE's of the Sub-Division, so that the genuineness of the claim is established and when the consumer approaches, the officers should be able to explain the basis more readily.

In a meeting taken by the Hon'ble Minister for Revenue and Planning, to discuss and hear at first hand, the problems of farmers and to find solutions, it was reported that a number of Ryots were facing hardships due to disconnection of pumpsets for revenue dues, and they were unable to clear the arrears on account of drought and other circumstances.

The matter was reviewed in a meeting taken by the Chief Secretary to Government, and the following instructions are issued-

1. In case I.P. set consumers (whose pumpset installations are disconnected for revenue arrears) approach for re-connection, the extent of arr-

ears, may be made known to them and instalment facility (up to six monthly instalments) may be permitted.

2. The instalment payment will be in addition to the normal Revenue Demand after reconnection, and interest as per rules will apply.

The Assistant Executive Engineers, Elecl., may exercise the above powers at the Sub-Divisional level, and a list of such cases in which instalment facility is allowed by them may be furnished to the concerned Division office, indicating the amount of arrears and the number of monthly instalments permitted.

NOTE

One of the most important ways of mobilising additional revenues is to enforce disconnections of defaulting installations. If these are not carried out effectively amounts due from consumers naturally go up.

The details of amounts due from the consumers is readily available from the month's DCB statements. Normally, the 'Balance' should not be more than twice the 'Demand' if disconnections are enforced effectively in case of defaulters.

Details of division-wise demand as on 31-3-1987 and balances as at the end of the month for which DCB is received and as also 31-3-1987 and the ratio of balance to demand are furnished in the enclosed statement. This will give a relative idea of what is happening in various divisions. It can be also seen from the statement that there are some divisions where the ratio is very much higher.

It is true that you are helpless in recovery of dues from certain classes of consumers and consequently the 'dues' from them continue to grow. Water supply installations, lift-irrigation schemes and some public

sector installations belong to that category. Similarly 'dues' may also accrue from defunct installations.

As the head of the division, it is necessary that you along with the Accounts Officer should review in great detail sub-division-wise DCBs, identify the balances (high value items) that cannot be recovered and prepare a statement showing what would be the level of balances in case these irrecoverable dues are excluded. Further, you have to review whether the balances are not collected due to laxity or lapse of the concerned sub-divisional officers or their subordinates.

As a step in this direction, the sub-divisional officers may be called during this month to come with relevant details and detailed discussions held with them. The Asst. Executive Engineers should prepare a consolidated report in the manner suggested above and these may be reviewed by you and a report sent to the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer which should indicate the reasons for the high level of 'Balances' and steps you would like to take and the steps you would like the Board to take to bring the 'Balance' to a reasonable level.

You and your Accounts Officer should get totally involved in this exercise and programme drawn up by you to bring down the 'Balance' levels. This is one of the best ways to mobilise the revenues.

Your success in reducing the 'Balance' will be suitably appreciated.

It is hereby instructed that a Bulk meter may also be fixed at the cost of the Board, for multi storeyed buildings and shopping complexes to make a cross check of the total energy consumed by individual consumers. Action on this may be taken on top most priority.

The meter readers may be advised to check whether the meters are running or not, particularly when the energy consumption is very low.

Sub : Use of HDPE/RPVC pipes for submersible pumpsets.

- Ref :** 1. Board Notification No. KEB/B11/991/85-86 dt. 25-3-87.
2. Government Order No. PWD 175 EEB 87 dated 8-2-88.

Instructions of the Board were issued vide Board Notification No. KEB/B11/991/85-86 dated 25-3-87 that "even in the case of submersible type pumpsets, HDPE pipes shall only be used".

Government in their order dated 8-2-1988 cited above, have stated that the choice of the type of pipes to be used, whether HDPE/RPVC or G. I. pipe, should be left to the discretion of the farmer installing a submersible pumpset for a bore well.

Under the circumstances, it is hereby ordered that the directions contained in Board Notification No. KEB/B11/991/85-86 dated 25-3-87 would stand relaxed in respect of submersible pumpsets only, and the choice of the type of pipes to be used may be left to the prospective consumer, and if he so desires, he may be permitted to use G. I. pipes.

It is however clarified that for pumpsets other than bore wells, the use of HDPE/RPVC pipes will remain unaltered.

The above would come into force with immediate effect.

Sub : Poor progress in respect of Bhagyajyothi Scheme for the year 1987-88.

From the review of the progress achieved regarding electrification of the house-holds of the poorer section of the society under Bhagyajyothi scheme, it is alarming to note that against the targets of 8000 installations to be serviced as per programme upto the end of January 1988, the progress has been only 4,479. As you

are aware, the annual target for 87-88 is 25,000 installations and failure to achieve the progress set forth will invite severe criticism at the highest level of the Govt. and also from other sections. It is imperative that in the month of February and March 1988, not only the slippages in the previous months have to be made up but also the target set for the balance of this year's target has to be achieved, at any cost.

The matter was also discussed in detail during 17th Chief Engineers meeting held on 10-2-88 and all the Zonal Chief Engineers, Elecy., assured that the annual target would be met.

It is also relevant to note that excuses like shortage of materials, labour etc., will not hold good for any slackness in respect of Bhagyajyothi scheme, since only Contractors have to be awarded with the work pertaining to the installations of identified beneficiaries. Reference is also invited to Board Circular No. KEB/B11/1892/87-88/BJ dated 17-12-87 wherein it was made very clear that in the absence of the Mandal Panchayats coming forward with the lists of identified beneficiaries in time, the matter has to be taken up with the concerned Chief Secretaries of the Zilla Parishats and lists obtained and the targets set forth are achieved.

Please ensure that there is no slippage on any account in achieving the target in respect of Bhaya-jyothi schemes in your division.

NOTE

While analysing the energy balance sheet of Bellary Division No. 1, there are certain glaring revelations which are discussed below.

The energy in-put into the two Bellary Sub-Divisions from Bellary Sub-Station and Venkatapur has gone up from 77.71 MUs during 1983-84 to 81.74 MUs during 1985-86. While this is so, the energy sale to certain categories of installations has come down despite increase in number of installations. The following statement indicates the trend in consumption of the L. T. installations.

In other words, the average consumption of LT-1 installations has come down from 22-00 to 17-51 that of AEH installations from 168 to 146 and that of LT-3 from 70 to 61. This clearly indicates that there is some malpractice going on. Similar trends may be prevailing in your jurisdiction also. This needs to be checked thoroughly by yourself and your Asst. Accounts Officer. The procedure to be followed is to study the trend ledger by ledger. In case of ledgers where the sales have come down a detailed investigation have to be made.

As a step in this direction, you may collect the figures i.e. category wise sales as has been done for the Bellary Sub-Divisions and fill the data in the enclosed proforma and send copies of the same to the Chief Engineer, Elec. (Genl), Zonal Chief Engineers, Electricity and to the Division Office. As can be seen from the statement, the data should be for a period of four years and if you cannot get for such a long period, you can give the information for a shorter period giving reasons therefor. Since the DCB for 1986-87 is completed in most of the Sub-Divisions, it should not be difficult to fill up the proforma and if in some cases DCB is not ready, only energy figures may be compiled and the proforma filled.

As has been done earlier, if some areas are fed from some other sub-divisions or if the feeder goes beyond your sub-division, appropriate corrections may be made and what has been done may be explained in the proforma. More importantly, this proforma will give you a clear picture as to what is happening in

your Sub-Division and you could take action to investigate into the causes of lower sales in the manner I suggested in the earlier paras.

I am sure that if all of you along with your Asst. Accounts Officers carry out this exercise, the revenues of the Board will jump up significantly.

IMMEDIATE**NOTE**

As you are aware the State is facing the worst power crisis ever. It is necessary that all the employees of the Board (Officers & Workers), contribute in their official and personal capacities to the conservation of electricity. You might have read in newspapers that the Power Minister has also mentioned about the need to save energy by the employees of the Board while announcing the power cuts.

As a first step in this direction, the energy consumption in offices, stores, sub-stations, etc., of the Board should be reduced by at-least 20%. You can monitor this because in most of these places meters have been fixed.

Meetings have to be held with employees and Union representatives and in these meetings need to reduce the consumption in offices and in residences has to be stressed and strategies worked out. It is of no use merely to talk in general terms but the energy saved should be quantified and every sub-division may send

a report on monthly basis indicating approximately energy saved by the various measures taken by them.

These reports may be compiled by the EEs who will compile and send the same to the office of the Chief Engineer for analysis and record.

Please note again that KEB should set an example in conservation of energy and this has to be quantified. We have to show to the public that we mean business.

NOTE

As you know, we are facing a very severe power crisis this year. The energy cuts were enhanced substantially with a view to balance the availability with the demand. For your information, it was the intention of the Board to bring down the average daily consumption from 31 million units to 26.5 million units.

a) by way of enhancing the cuts on various categories of consumers,

and

b) by resorting to load shedding to rural feeders.

Instructions regarding load shedding were issued on 4-9-87 and 7-9-87 and I learn that actual load shedding has been given effect to on different dates in different divisions and probably Circles also.

As you might be experiencing already, there is a tremendous resistance against the load sheddings from 6 A.M. to 2 P.M. Some of the reasons given are :—

- a) over-voltages and under-voltages in transmission lines ;
- b) over-loading of distribution transformers ;
- c) over-loading of feeders ;
- d) over-loading of the substation transformers due to the reduction in diversity ;
- e) difficulties in irrigating the land during evening hours ;
- f) land cannot accept/absorb water in the evening hours ;
- g) lot of water will be wasted by evaporation as water is not picked up during mornings ;
- h) industries cannot work effectively with 8 hours shut-down ;

i) there is problem of labourers coming during evening hours for work ;

j) there will be a severe production loss and damage to the products due to interruptions in installations like cold storage plants, milk dairy, etc. ;

and

k) water supply to the Villages, Towns and Cities are affected.

All these aspects are being examined at the highest level. The main objective of load shedding is to conserve the energy. If this is not realised, we should reconsider minimising the interruption and consequently causing inconvenience to the consumers. For this purpose, some vital information is required, i.e., the extent of reduction in consumption before load shedding and after load shedding.

You will get a picture when you compare the energy consumption on each feeder, five days before and after the introduction of load shedding, for the sake of uniformity and ease of analysis the information may be furnished in the proforma enclosed for every feeder in every sub-station under your control positively before 1st October 1987. If necessary send your officer from Headquarters and compile the data. The data should be sent in the same form enclosed herewith to the Superintending Engineer (Elect.), Load Despatch Centre, KEB., Bangalore, and with copies to your

Zonal Chief Engineers and the Superintending Engineers (Elect.) of Circles.

**Sub : Use of safety belts - Extract from Power
Monthly Newsletter of BHEL Power
Sector.**

The use of safety belts by our line staff, to ensure safety and avoidance of accidents, while working have been stressed in Circulars issued from the Board and the Chief Engineer, Elecyc(G1) time and again. The following extract from the BHEL periodical, is self explanatory and would indicate how the use of safety belt can many a time save the employee's life ;

Life Saved by Safety Belt

How the use of a safety belt saved the life of a tack welder at Sabarmati Site and how the use of helmet saved a rigger at Mettur Site were reported in earlier issues of 'Power'.

On 11th September 1987 at about 15.00 hours a welder's helper was engaged in placing floor grills at 14 m level in Boiler Unit IV under construction at Vishakapatnam Site. He accidentally touched the live welding holder kept nearby and was thrown back violently due to electric shock. He fell through a gap, but remained hanging in air as the safety belt on his person was properly tied to a bracing. He escaped with only minor injuries, whereas he could have died had he not been wearing the safety belt".

It is observed that in most cases, investigation of accidents have shown that the cause of death is not necessarily electric shock received while working on lines, but due to injuries consequent on the fall from the pole top, some times resulting in spinal injuries or head injuries. The safety belt will protect the man's life in all such cases. As such, use of safety belts may be encouraged and insisted upon.

Sub: Operational guidelines for Load Management of the Karnataka System Load Shedding.

Ref.: CEE (G)'s Office Order No. T/Cys. 19/ dt. 15-4-1987.

Reference is invited to the detailed guidelines issued by the Chief Engineer, Elec. (Genl) in his above Circular dated 15-4-1987.

Complaints are being received in the Board, that the period and frequency of load shedding operations (as actually implemented) do not conform to any norm, particularly with reference to the duration of outages caused.

The Hon'ble Minister of State for Power has also voiced his concern over the complaints received at Government level. The operational guidelines already issued may be studied and it is necessary that-

- i) the inconvenience caused due to load shedding, to obtain required load relief, may be spread over all the feeders in the Station excluding Rural Feeders which are subject to 8 hour rural load shedding,

- ii) the duration of unscheduled load sheddings, particularly in the evenings, should be limited to 30 minutes, and in case of need, the feeder opened out should be closed and the next feeder opened to obtain relief.

It is very necessary that registers be maintained in the various stations to indicate the details of the scheduled and unscheduled Urban load sheddings, indicating clearly the time of opening of feeder and that of charging it and the duration of actual interruption. This register will be useful for reference by the Superintendent Engineer (El.), Load Despatch, and also ensure that no particular feeder is kept open unduly long, nor any feeder being exempt partly or fully.

On my way to Chintamani, I saw a transformer being erected (replacement by a bigger one). I stopped and asked the Asst. Engineer incharge Shri Kariappa why the transformer was not painted, why it was not to the plumb, and whether crimping terminals were used. The oil has not been tested.

Oil testing is a must particularly when a released transformer is being used. otherwise we may lose the transformer itself.

As regards crimping terminals, he said "he has not been able to draw from the day he took charge about 9 months ago, one piece from the stores and had to borrow from firms".

Imagine this happening in Bangalore, where I had given a free hand to the SE and EEs to buy crimpig sockets they required from Dowells. What will happen to the morale of the official if he does not get what he wants for the works and had to go outside to borrow them?

Chief Engineer, Elec. (MM&P) may take action to keep buffer stocks of sockets and even tools to consider making rate contracts and to consider giving sockets on imprest to works. The Chief Engineers, Superintending Engineers and Executive Engineers, may please take steps to ensure availability of good quality sockets and tools.

NOTE

Even as I sit in my room my thoughts dwell on the high system loss. When the tariff was revised a few days ago, there was criticism from the public that the Board should concentrate on reduction of losses rather than simply raising the rates.

No doubt, over the last 3 years, awareness amongst you is greater than ever before. But my own assessment is that there is not enough of it. Energy balance sheets for every sub-station and feeders have to be

prepared. Not many are doing it. Even when some are prepared, due attention is not given. This exercise should not be considered as a work but as a hobby. The AEE's & JE's should join hands, collect data and analyse.

In the monthly meetings at every level one of the subject to be discussed should be ;- what has been done to reduce losses.

Being qualified engineers, can we afford to lose 2000 million units which costs more than Rs. 100 Crores? Can we as a fraternity move about without getting embarrassed by justified criticism!

Reduction of losses can't become a centralised activity. This attitude and culture should inculcate into every one of us from the overseyer onwards to the Chief Engineer. If nearly 4,000 of you make up your mind, I am confident that we can bring down the losses to 17% instead of the present 22%.

There is a syseem improvement cell to assist you and some special units are also created at circle levels to identify areas of high losses. But it is you who are incharge of Operation & Maintenance, who can achieve better results if only you mind.

I have in my Circular's indicated through examples how losses can be reduced with relatively less efforts.

- a) How by installing capacitors, the cost is recovered in less than a year.

- b) How by drawing an express line to take away part of the loads of overload line, energy savings in one year will be more than the cost of the line.
- c) How by reducing the length of the LT lines by erecting new TCs, the losses can be reduced by more than 700 times.

It is your personal zeal, which can achieve results. If you have any particular plan of action and cannot implement due to certain difficulties, I don't mind your writing a letter to me directly, I will try to solve them.

Don't forget

"REDUCTION OF LOSSES" should be your motto

NOTE

On 25th May 1987, I had the occasion to review the financial progress of some of the Major Works coming under the control of Superintending Engineer, (Elect), Major Works Circle, KEB, Bangalore. I am writing this note to bring home to those concerned directly how the financial progress has to be monitored and why it is important to do so. This is best illustrated through an example.

The project cost of the Subramanyapura Sub-Station (220 KV) is about Rs. 6.8 Crores & the work envisaged is the installation of 2 numbers of 100 MVA transformers, 220 KV to 66 KV. The first transformer was commissioned in September, 1986. The outlay as furnished to the Board as on 31st March 1987 was Rs. 2.2 Crores which is prima-facie wrong. Let us first understand the implications of furnishing such a figure. The budget provisions for such major works are observed at the Planning Commission level & it became very difficult to convince why we needed Rs. 4 Crores only when a transformer and the associated switchgear have to be installed. Secondly, if based on the outlay figures, provision of Rs. 4 Crores made for 1987-88,

will deprive the funds to other schemes. Further, the outlay on Subramanyapura station itself will be much less and the Board will be accused of under-spending.

Budgeting is a very important exercise & greatest care has to be taken in providing right amounts to be spent in a particular year. Otherwise, the funds cannot be utilised to the best advantage of the organisation. It is possible that we exceed the provisions or spend less than what is provided for, both of which are bad.

The point I want to impress in this connection is that it is a very simple exercise particularly in respect of major works to correlate the physical figures with the financial outlay. So far the experience has been that the financial outlay is generally less than the physical figures. This can be very easily remedied, if once in a fortnight, the Executive Engineer, Accounts Officer and the Asst. Accounts Officer review the 'C' Registers to verify :

- a) Whether the right cost has been shown against the materials drawn.
- b) Whether all the postings have been carried out.
- c) Whether there is over drawal or under drawal compared to the budget provision.
- d) Whether labour provision has been exceeded.

When I held a meeting with the officers of the Superintending Engineer, (Elect), Major Works Circle, the Accounts Officer was not able to explain why this so and he did not appear to know in what manner the 'C'

Registers had to be scrutinised and to what purpose. I observed a similar situation recently when I discussed the progress of works of Mysore Major Works. It is necessary for the AOs/AAOs incharge of Major Works to realise how important it is to keep the 'C' Registers up to date and accurately. This is not difficult, for as I mentioned earlier, half an hour of review and appropriate advise to the 'C' Register Clerk would go a long way in removing the inconsistencies, I had mentioned earlier.

If the AOs and the EEs do not give due attention to this aspect and if the SEEs and their DCAs and AOs do not review the manner in which the 'C' Registers are posted, apart from giving a wrong picture of the physical progress, the entire Major Works wing would be placed in an embarrassing situation.

I hope that atleast in future on receipt of this note, the officers whom I have mentioned and particularly the AOs and AAOs will give utmost importance to the maintenance of 'C' Registers and get into the habit of analysing the outlays and exercise a check over the over-drawals or excessive expenditure on labour, transport etc.

All these things are well laid out in the accounts code and I think this letter will activate you all.

NOTE

You may be knowing that the transformer failure rate has increased significantly during the last two years.

The tentative figure for 1986-87 is 5,247, which is 9.6% of the total number of transformers in the Board.

Don't you think, it is criminal to lose so many transformers? The disadvantages of these failures, I would like to repeat, though you may be aware of them.

1. Loss to an extent of several crores of rupees ;
2. Extra labour ;
3. Poor progress of works because work force is diverted for replacement ;
4. Shortage of transformers for new works ;
5. Loss of image before the public and severe criticism by them ;
6. Indirect loss to society such as failure of crops, loss of production.

Why should there be failures in such large numbers? The causes could be :

- a) poor quality of transformers ;
- b) loose spans on secondary side, causing frequent short circuits ;
- c) Improper protection by LA's and fuses ;
- d) Overloading ;
- e) extraneous causes like tree branches falling.

We in the Board are buying transformers from established firms and there should be no complaint on this ground.

I have told you any number of times on various occasions the need to carry out line and transformer maintenance. You may have to give special attention and chart out a regular programme for these maintenance works.

But in this note, I would like to dwell on the issue of overloading. Because of pressures and shortage in the supply of transformers, additional loads have been connected over and above the capacity of transformers. I may relate my own experience in this connection. when I was Chief Engineer, Elecy. (South), there was not a day when there was not a report of failure of a transformer in Bangalore City. I called all the EEs and AEEs and discussed the reason. The general complaint was that of overload. I asked them to justify the statement, by giving me the peak loads on transformers (through tong testers) within a fortnight. This, they did, and out of the 1350 transformers, 130 were overloaded,

I could persuade the Board to supply 130 transformers all of 250 KVA capacity and in about 6 months, the head-ache of transformer failures virtually vanished.

You may adopt the same strategy and instruct your staff to take peak load current readings on all the TC's in their jurisdiction and a consolidated statement may be sent to Chief Engineer, Elec. (MM & P) who has been instructed to procure additional transformers and TC sets and accessories to meet your needs.

But this is not the peak load season for TCs with pump sets in which case please identify the TCs where the connected load is 25% more than the capacity. The data to be sent should reach before 1st August to Chief Engineer, Elec. (MM & P) in the proforma enclosed.

You do your job. Board will assist you in all respects.

There will be no reminders on this Note.

Procedure for Dismantling of Assets

Date of Effect : 1st April 85

1. Preamble :

1.1 With the introduction of Uniform Commercial Accounting System, the existing procedure for dismantling of Assets and accountal thereof, in the connected account records requires modifications. Existing procedure in this regard suffers from several deficiencies, such as :—

- i) Proper distinction is not made between Revenue and Capital.
- ii) Dismantled Asset is taken to stock at original Book value, thus inflating gross assets.
- iii) Loss or gain in disposal of assets is not reflected in the accounts.
- iv) Due to incomplete particulars in the estimates, value of released assets along with accumulated depreciation is often not removed from the gross assets etc.

1.2 In order to eliminate the above deficiencies, a revised procedure in supersession of paras 252 to 261 and 486 to 495 (applicable to transformers and other items except meters) of Karnataka Electricity Board, Accounts Manual Vol. II as amended from time to time prescribed in the following paragraphs shall come into force with effect from 1-4-1985.

- 1.3 Consequent on adoption of Commercial Accounting System with effect from 1-4-1985, the Asset Accounts will be maintained at Divisional level.
- 1.4 Assets may be decommissioned or dismantled for various reasons, e. g. frequent break - down, obsolescence, assets becoming surplus for certain reasons etc., In any of these cases, the assets decommissioned, may be replaced by new equipments.
- 1.5 Replacements may be classified into two categories i.e., Major and Minor. Expenditure on Major replacements will be treated as 'Capital' expenditure, while expenditure on Minor replacements will be charged off to the Revenue of the year. Broadly, if any, "replacement" results in prolonging the life of the Assets or increase the earning capacity/productivity, such a replacement, may be treated as Major replacement and expenditure incurred thereon may be capitalised. With effect from 1-4-1985, separate fixed asset records are maintained for 'Individual Assets' in certain categories and for 'Group Assets' in other categories. In general, replacement of any individual Asset or part of a 'Group Asset' which will have the effect of extending the life of the group asset, shall be considered as Major replacement. eg. Replacement of faulty/burnt out transformer/equipment by new transformer/equipment of the same capacity. All other replacements of parts of assets, required

to be carried out in the course of normal operations, shall be treated as Minor replacements and charged off to the Revenue of the concerned year.

1.6 Expenditure on Major replacements may be booked in the capital Section under the head of Account 14.150-CWIP-Improvement, while the expenditure on 'Minor replacement' may be charged off to the Revenue under the Account group 74 - Repairs and Maintenance.

1.7 This revised procedure may be read in conjunction with Board Order No. KEB/B19/345/85-86 dated 28-6-85, in which a new procedure for preparation of estimates for decommissioning of assets has been prescribed.

2.0 Dismantling of Assets :

2.1 Dismantling of an asset involves removal of the asset from use. Dismantling of an existing asset i.e., line/equipment may become necessary for its replacement before the normal prescribed life of the asset, for some reasons or for discarding the asset after prescribed period.

3.0 Replacement of Assets :

3.1 Replacement of an asset means substitution of one fixed asset by another. Replacement may be a Major replacement or a Minor replacement.

3.1.1 Major Replacement :

In the light of the principles enunciated in the preamble, a few examples of Major replacements are given below for guidance :—

- i) Replacement of faulty/burnt out transformer/equipment by new transformer/equipment of the same capacity.
- ii) Replacement of lower capacity transformer/equipment by higher capacity transformer/equipment or vice - versa.
- iii) Replacement of an existing line by another line for improvement of its capacity.
- iv) Replacement of an existing line by another line of the same or higher capacity in its place by changing its present location.
- v) Replacement of any component of a large equipment.

3.1.2 Minor Replacement :

Replacement of a part of any asset is a minor replacement such as :

- i) Replacement of poles, pole supports, insulators cut-outs, cross-arms, bolts and nuts etc.,
- ii) Reconditioning of snapped conductors.
- iii) Replacement of insulating oil.

3.2 Pursuant to the introduction of Commercial Accounting System and Procedures, the original cost and the accumulated depreciation of the old replaced assets should be withdrawn from Gross Block and accounted, under "16.2 WDV of dismantled or faulty assets" and the expenditure on the new asset be capitalised. In the case of assets discarded permanently as well, the cost of the assets and the depreciation of the assets dismantled should be transferred to Account Group "16.2 WDV of dismantled/faulty assets" and the cost of dismantling should be charged to the Revenue Account. In view of this, the Board has issued a simplified form of estimate and guidelines vide Board Order No. KEB/B19-345/85-86 dated 28th June 1985. The implications of the new procedure in the preparation and sanction of estimates in respect of assets dismantled either for replacement or for discarding permanently are outlined below :

3.3 Estimate :

3.3.1 In the case of major replacements, estimates shall be prepared separately for erection of new assets and dismantling of the existing assets, assigning separate work orders with cross reference in the estimate. In the case of minor replacements, a single estimate for the net amount is sufficient.

3.3.2 Estimate for Erection of an Asset

An estimate for erection of a new asset shall be sanctioned under the budget head 'Improvement'

in the Capital Section. The net expenditure on Minor replacement shall be charged to revenue under the Account Group '74-Repairs & Maintenance'.

3.3.3 Estimate for Dismantling of an Asset :

- i) Estimates for dismantling of assets shall be sanctioned under the Account Group '77.5 Asset De-commissioning cost' irrespective of whether the dismantling of asset is due to replacement or otherwise.
- ii) The labour charges included in amount of the estimate is debitable to 'employee cost' under the appropriate head of account under the group head '75 other charges like transportation charges etc., are debitable to the Account Group '77.5-Asset De-Commissioning cost'. In cases where the works are entrusted to an outside agency, the labour charges payable to the outside agency should be booked under the Account Group '77.5 Asset De-commissioning cost' (Category-wise).
- iii) Particulars of assets dismantled, year of commissioning and month/year of dismantling of assets shall be furnished in the estimate. If the year of commissioning is not known it should be assessed and the basis for assessment recorded jointly by Executive Engineer, (Elecl.), and Accounts Officer of the Division in the estimate.

iv) The Accounts Section in the Division Office shall furnish in the estimate the following particulars :—

- 1) Original cost/assessed value of the assets to be dismantled.
- 2) Depreciation earned.
- 3) Writtendown value of the assets dismantled.

v) If the original cost is not available, the cost shall be assessed on the basis of the Standard Rate/Purchase Rate of the year or any other data available after adding estimated labour and indirect charges.

vi) The report of the estimate should contain the following particulars in addition to the usual particulars as are required vide para 233 of the Accounts Manual Volume II.

- 1) Spot Inspection certificate.
- 2) Reasons for the deterioration of asset earlier than the expected time.
- 3) Circumstances related to failure.
- 4) Whether the materials released now could be used elsewhere for temporary and other works.
- 5) Failure report in the case of faulty transformers.

4.0 Accounting Procedures of Dismantled Asset :

- 4.1 On dismantling of an asset, it shall be returned to Stores with a Regular Return Invoice.
- 4.2 On receipt of the dismantled asset at Stores, Whether it is good/faulty/Scrap, the Store Keeper shall acknowledge the receipt of the dismantled asset and draw a receipt voucher and take the item to stock.
- 4.3 On drawing a voucher, the details shall be entered in a separate dismantled Asset store Ledger, and sent to the Division Office, along with other Store Receipt Vouchers and Issue Invoices. The existing ledger form may be utilised for this purpose.
- 4.4 On receipt of the voucher, the Pricing Ledger Section shall furnish the written-down value of the asset and enter the amount and other particulars in the dismantled Asset pricing Ledger, which is to be maintained separately in future.
- 4.5 The Accounts Section will transfer the original asset cost and accumulated depreciation to the Account Group "16.2 Written-down value of faulty/dismantled assets".
- 4.6 The Accounts Section shall maintain a Register for dismantled Assets in the form as given in the Annexure-I which contains the details of original asset cost, depreciation till date, written down value of asset and the manner of disposal of the asset.

Note : In Board Order No. KEB/B7-1969/81-82 dated 1-4-1985 Vide Annexure-8 a Proforma for entering the details of such dismantled assets has been prescribed vide Annexure-III to the Annexure-8. This form has been slightly modified and re-numbered as Annexure-I.

5. Released Assets Found Useful / Repairable / not Useful :

5.1 Released Assets Found Useful :

The released assets which could be used elsewhere without carrying out any repairs shall be kept along with the other fresh materials. Whenever such materials are drawn for works such released good materials of the asset are expected to be drawn first, for use in other works and hence the materials in the Dismantled Asset Store Ledger should be charged off first till the materials in that ledger are cleared. The issue invoice shall be valued in such cases at written-down value and entered in the pricing ledger in the Division office.

5.2 Released Assets Found Repairable :

5.2.1 The released assets such as distribution/power transformers, circuit breakers and other equipments found faulty and repairable shall be sent to the Meter testing division through a Regular Invoice and Advice of Transfer with written

down value giving details of asset description, Sl. No., year of installation, original cost, depreciation till date.

Note : Released assets such as 220 KV Breakers, 11KV breakers and certain 66/33KV transformers repairable at the Division need not be sent to M.T. Division, Bangalore. But M.T. Division shall arrange for repair of these released assets at the Division. The released assets shall be issued to the Officer-in-charge of repair on numerical account. The repair shall be carried out on a separate estimate sanctioned under Account Group "74.101 Repairs and maintenance to P & M - M.T." After repair, the repaired asset shall be returned to the concerned store on numerical account.

5.2.2 The M.T. Division will acknowledge the Invoice and accept the Advice of Transfer in the usual manner and record the particulars of the transferred assets in their respective Dismantled Asset Registers and also debit the value to the respective account heads in the General Ledger.

5.2.3 The M.T. Division will do necessary tests and a report will be furnished in respect of the oil level of the transformers, condition of winding, condition of the bushings etc. Further, the assets such as transformers/equipments received at M.T. Division which could be repaired, shall

be retained for reconditioning departmental or repairs by a private agency. Other transformers/equipments which are not repairable, will be sent to the Central Stores Division at the written down value, with all the particulars and report through Regular Invoice under Inter-Unit Account.

- 5.2.4 After effecting necessary repairs at the M. T. Division will allocate the cost of repair to the repairs and maintenance head of account i.e., '74.101 Repairs and Maintenance to Plant and Machinery M.T.'.
- 5.2.5 If the repairs are carried out by an outside agency or department the expenses will be debited to '74.110 R & M to P & M - others.'
- 5.2.6 These repaired transformers/equipments will have to be issued to various divisions under allotment from the Superintending Engineer, (Elect.), Material Management Cell.
- 5.2.7 The transformers/equipments returned to the Central Stores Division as irreparable will have to be disposed off by auction after draining out the transformer Oil. The transformer oil drained out from the transformer should be taken under a separate head "used transformer oil" at Nil value and stored in tankers and will be issued for filtering/reclaiming as the case may be at M.T. Division. The released transformer oil has to be accounted for,

- a) at M.T. Division in respect of transformers retained for reconditioning.
- b) at Central Stores Division in respect of transformers received for disposal by auction.

5.3 Released assets found not useful :

Released assets found not useful will be treated as scrap.

5.3.1 Scrapping of Assets :

Upon scrapping of assets (returned to stores as dismantled assets) by the field officers, a "Certificate for scrapping of assets" shall be prepared in triplicate by the officer concerned and two copies given to Stores. This procedure applies in the case of dismantled assets classified as scrap by the M.T. Divisions and sent to C.S.D. for disposal.

- 5.3.2 The Accounts Section on receipt of the above document and store invoice will transfer the written down value of the asset from the Account Group "16.2 Written down value of faulty/dismantled asset" account to the Account Group "16.1 written down value of obsolete/scrapped asset" account and also transfer the particulars and value of the asset from the Dismantled Asset Register (Annexure-I) to the Scrapped Asset Register (Annexure-II).

5.3.3 Disposal of Scrapped Assets :

- a) The items appearing in the Scrapped Asset Register will be placed before the competent authority for approving the scrapping of the assets.
- b) On approval, the scrapped assets which are not disposed at Division shall be sent for disposal to the Central Stores Division, KEB., Bangalore, through Regular Invoice under Account Group "32.703 Inter Unit Account Capital Expenditure and fixed Assets with written down value.
- c) On receipt of scrapped Assets, the C.S.D. shall account the same by drawing a regular receipt voucher, posting the details of transactions to the scrapped Asset Ledger and sending the voucher in the usual manner to the Accounts Section of the Chief Engineer, Electricity (MM & P).
- d) On receipt of receipt voucher in the Accounts Section of the Chief Engineer, Electy. (MM & P) shall value the receipts at the written down value as indicated in the invoice of the sending Division.
- e) On sale of scrapped Assets the same shall be invoiced to the concerned purchaser under the Account Group "16.1 written down value of obsolete scrapped asset";

- f) Sale proceeds of scrapped assets shall be credited to 28.105 Sundry Debtors for other miscellaneous income.
- g) The gain or loss on sale of scrapped assets shall be treated as Revenue. However, gain, if any, in excess of the accumulated depreciation shall be treated as a Capital gain and credited to Capital Reserve.
- h) The scrapped asset for which no scrap/salvage value is realised (loss on sale) the written down value of such assets shall be charged to "77.710 Written down value of assets scrapped."

5.4. As far as meters are concerned, the present practice is to be continued as laid down in the Accounts Manual, Volume II and Circular instructions that are issued in separate Board Orders.

The total of the amount in the dismantled Assets or scrapped Assets Registers shall be tallied with the respective accounts in the General Ledger at the end of each quarter.

6.0 Shifting an Asset to another place :

Any expenditure incurred on shifting assets from one place to another place will regardless of the amount of expenditure, be charged to revenue in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

Accounting entries are furnished in the Annexure-III.

Accounting Entries

When an asset is dismantled it should be invariably sent to the nearest store where its condition should be examined. If it does not require any repairs, it may be issued to any other work undertaken in the same division either immediately or in future. However, if the asset requires repairs it should be sent to the M.T. Division for repairs. After repair, it may be sent back either to the original Division or to any other division requiring the asset.

On the other hand, if the asset is not repairable it may be sent to the Central Stores Division where it should be declared as scrap and disposed off.

The accounting entries should be passed under each of the situations mentioned above are set out below :

NOTE

Two days ago, both the main cables of the transformers at Kunigal failed with several punctures. The main reason for these punctures is due to the fact that these cables were in contact at these points with the earth-mat.

It is possible that during a surge, the potential difference between the cable and the earth-mat might have been the reason for the cause of flash. This is an important lesson to learn. In future, the routes of the 11 KV cables should be far away from the earth-mats.

Yet another instance to take note of is the cable of the tertiary of the 100 MVA transformer which developed a trouble due to a fault between the tertiary and the capacitor bank. On verification, it was found that the rating of the cable was 6.35/11KV. Therefore, in future, it is directed that only fully insulated 11 KV cables have to be used in all Stations.

NOTE**How O & M officers can detect theft of
Energy & Increase Revenues**

Usually it is the industrial and commercial installations, which indulge in theft of energy, with or without the connivance of some dishonest employees.

Vigilance Cells have detected hundreds of cases. But vigilance cell alone cannot copeup with the task.

It is basically the job of the O & M staff to keep a vigilant eye on such installations. Discreet observation by meter readers, overseers, JE's and AE's can help detect cases of theft.

Yet another way of detecting such cases, is through review of ledgers. Recently vigilance detected two cases, where fake seals had been fixed. For a 20 HP installation with good business the consumption for 6 manths was only 5538 Units or about 900 units a month. You will appreciate that this is a low figure for a 20 HP installation.

The Senior Assistant or Asst. Accounts Officer or Asst. Engineer or Asst. Executive Engineer could have observed this and carried out special inspections and detected this. It would have been a credit to the O&M staff.

Therefore, all the staff mentioned above should review the ledgers in respect of industrial, commercial (and sometimes other installation also) at least once a month and maintain a record of such reviews for review by inspecting officers.

This procedure, I am confident, will bring down the cases of theft drastically.

This inspection may be made with immediate effect.

Rewards will be given to the employees on the recommendation of the Executive Engineer.

Need for closer review and Inspection of Offices

As the inspection of offices by Executive Engineers, Dy. Controller of Accounts and above was rather sketchy and cursory, two new systems were introduced :

- a) Maintenance of Inspection Registers in each office where instructions are to be recorded and followed up by the concerned ;
- b) Detailed printed formats to assist the inspecting officers not to miss any aspect, during the course of inspection.

But my impression is that the old practice of superficial, non-result oriented inspections are still being carried out.

I will cite an example. There were persistent complaints from some farmers that they have not got supply even though they have waited for more than two years. I could not believe this and got the Asst. Executive Engineer Kolar (where such complaints came

from) to Bangalore to ascertain the correct situation. It was rather shocking to learn that this was so. The sub-division had 90 cases where transformers had to be erected and thereafter power supply given. Another point that was revealed was that the contractors bills for labour contract had not been passed for nearly 3 years.

I wish to stress here that one of the objectives of inspecting officers visiting field offices is to ascertain the difficulties of the field staff and efforts made to solve their problems either at their level or pursuing at higher levels including that of the Board.

One of the difficulties expressed by the Asst. Exe. Engr. in passing of the bills was to carry out measurements the inability of work unit Asst. Engr. due to heavy work. This could have been solved by providing some temporary assistance through the JTA's, alternatively seeking creation of a temporary post. The main point I want to make out is that the senior officers were unaware of the serious problems of the sub-division.

If the concerned officers had inspected the sub-division in depth, a solution could have been found (and should have been).

I reiterate again that the officers should evince interest in solving the difficulties of their juniors and matter should be pursued till the problem is sorted out. It is only then that you will be able to command respect from juniors.

and give yet another instance of lack of involvement. On a surprise inspection of Srirangapatna sub-division office, I found 60 sets of Coyote strain clamps and 6 KMs of Coyote conductors (said to be stocked at Belagola) kept unused for several years. Every-body knew that the 11 KV line to the Paper Mills for which this materials is earmarked could not be taken up due to railway crossing problem. But no officer (including Superintending Engineer, (Elect), Material Management) who had visited the place in May 1987 has given any instructions regarding the usage or diversion of these items costing about a lakh of rupees which are required for 66 KV works.

Please be thorough in your inspections and try to solve the problems of the field staff. That is the only way to enhance the efficiency of the organisation.

What the Meter Readers can do

Meter Readers have a very important role to play in controlling mis-use of energy. This is because you are the people who have the closest contact with the consumers.

By being observant you can detect almost every type of malpractice that a dishonest consumer can indulge in.

But you have to be discern and courteous while carrying out your duties. On your rounds you can look into the following aspects besides meter reading :

- a) By your experience, you can yourself assess whether the consumption is reasonable or not. For example—if there is a large house with a number of people and AEH consumption is 150 to 200 units per month, please bring it to the notice of your higher authority.

Alternately, if a power installation of 50 HP consumes 500 units per month, it is again an area which needs to be checked.

- b) Once in a way please check if the meter seals are O.K. or the meter is tampered with.
- c) Please watch if any bypass of meter is being made. Check if there are signs of meter board being handled.
- d) Observe if there is any unauthorised connections extended to the neighbouring premises.

Please help the Board to check thefts and increase its revenue. A handsome and appropriate reward awaits you, when you detect cases of theft of energy.

Another small bit of advice, when any arrears item is included the consumer is likely to get unhappy and may seek clarification. Insist on the ledger clerk to enclose the details and basis for arrears. There is a separate sheet printed and given to ledger clerks for this purpose. Please advise the consumer courteously to contact the Asst. Engineer or Senior assistant when the consumer needs additional clarifications.

NOTE

"Need for having a system to take care of major troubles especially during holidays"

Being Ganesha festival everybody requires electricity. I got a call at around 9-30 a.m., that there was no electricity in Canara Bank Colony. The concerned Executive Engineer was telephoned by me and he gave me to understand that the staff have proceeded to attend to the line fault:

At 11 a.m. I got a call again from the consumer. Executive Engineer was not available at his house. The Asst. Executive Engineer of that area was available in his office. He mentioned that change-over had taken place from Remco to NRS. Immediately, I telephoned to the consumer only to know that he has not electricity still.

When I talked to Asst. Executive Engineer again, he told me that the particular transformer centre has no change-over facility. However the supply was restored from Remco but some officer of Kengeri had taken line clear. He did not know what for and for how long line clear was taken.

All these events reveal the weakness of the system. I have time and again suggested procedures, which are not being followed. I have to take drastic steps if the system does not improve.

The highlights of lapses in this incident are :

- 1) When a major feeder trouble took place – the substation operator should have informed the Executive Engineer concerned including Peenya Executive Engineer.
- 2) The service station Junior Engineer should have informed the Asst. Executive Engineers concerned about the problem and sought extra assistance.
- 3) Asst. Executive Engineers should have facility to rush to the trouble spot. They should keep their vehicles near their houses and drive them in emergencies like this.
- 4) The Executive Engineer should have continuously followed the progress. But instead he was not available on the phone (P & T and departmentally).
- 5) Immediate action should be initiated to develop change-over facilities and remove weakness in the system. I learn, but for the holiday, NRS could not have taken additional load and the Board could have landed into additional troubles.

CIRCULAR

Sub : Providing guardings to unguarded power line crossings.

Ref. : Circular No. T/EEG/CYS-311/86-87 dated 13th Jan. 1987 of CEE(G).,

I am directed to invite reference to the Circular of the Chief Engineer, Electricity, (General), cited above, wherein the details of the locations of the unguarded power line crossings with telecom was furnished along with the target dates within which period guardings have to be provided for these unguarded power line crossings. The target dates for completing all these works was fixed as December 1987 and it is absolutely essential that this programme schedule is strictly complied with.

In addition there is a feeling especially in the telecom department that the monthly targets fixed vide Circular above is not being complied with and there has been no reduction in the number of unguarded crossings. Apart from clearing the back log as per the list, it is absolutely essential to ensure that proper

guardings are provided as and when new works are executed without fail, wherever necessary.

In this connection reference is invited to rule No. 87 of I.E. Rulew 1956, wherein it is stipulated that the guardings that are to be provided either by the telecom department or by the Electricity Department, who so ever is the later entrant and also that the person proposing to erect a new line shall give one month's notice of his intention to do so along with relevant details of protection and drawings to the owner of the existing line in a manner laid down in the code of practice or guidelines prepared by the PTCC. Failure to comply with the above provision will necessarily lead to unguarded crossings giving scope for accidents to occur.

In the event of failure to provide the guardings, it may be noted that the telecom department will be free to serve a notice on the concerned jurisdictional officers of the KEB., that if the guardings are not provided within a month, the telecom department will execute this work and the cost of providing such guardings may be recovered from the Board authorities with the usual departmental charges.

In case the telecom department decide to take recourse to such action in the event of failure of KEB., to provide the guardings, it will not only be embarrassing to Board, but also lead to recovery of such charges levied on the KEB., to be recovered from the concerned jurisdictional officers.

Under these circumstances, so as not to give scope for accidents to occur and also to avoid unpleasant action on the officers of the KEB., I am directed to request you to ensure that the target of providing guardings to all unguarded power line crossings be positively completed before December 1987 as stipulated in the aforesaid circular.

NOTE**Sub :** Strategy to control theft of energy.

We have no doubt nearly 42 lakhs consumers but one can presume that only a few steal energy. It is not practicable, nor advisable to make an attempt to carry out checks of all the installations in service. We have to be discreet and keep a close watch on the big fish. We must also remember that the tendency for stealing the energy will be maximum in respect of those consumers whose income is affected substantially due to power shortage or of those who want to evade taxes.

From this angle, we have to concentrate on three categories, viz., H.T. Industries, L.T. Power Industries and large commercial installations. You know their number is hardly 12 per cent of the total number of installations. So by the process of elimination we have to concentrate on 4.3 lakhs of commercial installations, 1.8 lakhs of L.T. Power installations and 1,800 H.T. Power installations.

Process of elimination can go a step further. Out of 4.3 lakhs of Commercial lighting installations, probably 10 to 12 per cent can be considered as large viz., consumers having large show rooms, officers, big business houses, etc. A few in this group may be tempted to resort to malpractice. Thus, we have to check only around 40,000 large commercial lighting installations.

As regards L.T. Power installations, the availability of power is very crucial for their survival therefore the chances of pilferage are much more in this sector. Here again, to achieve better results, we have to classify the L.T. Power installations into 2 or 3 categories, viz., (a) with a connected load of 50 HP or more, (b) between 10 HP and 50 HP and (c) below 10 HP. Probably 5 per cent of L.T. Power installations will come under the category of (a) and about 20 to 25 per cent in category (b) and the rest under the category (c). We all know that the quantum of energy theft will be negligible in category (c) even if a few steal. Therefore, special attention has to be given to categories (a) and (b) which may come to around 50,000 installations.

In the H.T. sector, nearly 30 per cent are Government installations and Lift Irrigation Schemes and Public Sector Units, where the tendency for misuse of energy is minimal. In other words, the number of installations to be watched carefully, comes to only 1200.

With several hundreds of engineers working in the Board at various levels, the task of carrying out

surprise checks is not at all difficult on the limited number of installations.

Some of the measures that are to be followed are (a) to depute different officers to take meter readings, just prior to normal meter reading date, (b) verify from the ledger whether the energy consumed is reasonable compared to the connected load or maximum demand, (c) check the energy consumption with the sales turn over which will be available with the Commercial Tax or the Excise Duty Officers.

I have already issued circulars that senior officers must review the ledgers of LT installations which can reveal a lot of things. There may be intentional cases of (a) meters not recording (b) direct connections, (c) high capacity meters installed (d) disconnection notices not sent, etc. These checks are to be made as a matter of routine by the SEEs, EEEs, DCAs, AOs, AEEs and AEs. As mentioned earlier, the total number of installations to be covered is less than 1 lakh consumers and this approach will go a long way in controlling thefts effectively.

It is not as if we should not check energy consumption of AEH installations and Domestic lighting installations and smaller LT power installations and even Govt. installations. Here random checks should be adequate. Special attention may be necessary for AEH consumers because of temptation to consume more energy.

You are requested to carry out the checks as I have indicated earlier. This has however to be concretised in the form of a report for which a proforma is enclosed and sent to the office of the Chief Engineer Elec. (Genl.), Commercial Section. Such reports must be sent once a month by the EEEs in a consolidated form from their Divisions. If no checks are made you may say so, but don't fail to send the report.

With such reports, we would be able to counter the allegations that are often made about rampant pilferage and misuse of energy going unchecked.

I hope you will appreciate what I have said in this regard and take prompt action. **Please act Positively.**

You should cover all the installations in your jurisdiction in about 3 months time.

NOTE

During the review of the Administration Report of the Board for the year 1986-87, I observed that 4,600 Kms of 11KV lines and 14,000 KMs of LT distribution lines have been laid during the year. During every inspection, I have stressed for drawing more H.T. lines because of the various advantages like better regulation, reduction in system losses, etc. I was totally disappointed at this development because I had repeatedly given clear instructions to lay more H.T. lines than L.T. lines. My instructions seem to have fallen on deaf ears.

I would once again impress upon you to see that more H.T. lines are drawn. You may recall that the losses in H.T. lines is 700 times less than what takes place in the L.T. lines for the same length, for the same load conditions and for the same size of conductor. I cannot understand why you cannot appreciate this important aspect when every time we speak of reduction in system losses. You should also know that by drawing the L.T. lines indiscriminately and adding more loads, transformers get over-loaded and

transformers fail in large numbers. It is probably because of these, that number of transformer failures during the year 1986-87 is higher than every before. You must take personal interest to follow the above instructions and we will do our best to supply you with more distribution transformers.

It may also be noted that explanations will be called for wherever the LT distribution lines extended are significantly more than the extension of HT lines.

NOTE

At regular intervals, I have been reminding you about the need to control and reduce the system losses. I am adopting this strategy by sending circulars at regular intervals so as to bring to your mind the need to give special attention to the reduction of losses. There has been a tangible change in the approach of most of you. Still I consider it as rather inadequate. My desire is that an area of high losses should be spontaneously and instinctively recognised by you and your Asst. Exe. Engineers/Asst. Engineers. Then only it is possible to bring down the losses to a considerable level.

Why I mention this is that, despite my circular instructions, more LT lines have been erected than the H.T. lines and the number of transformers added to shorten the L.T. lines and consequently reduce the LT line losses, is not appreciable.

I would suggest that you convene a meeting once a month at the Divisional and Sub-Divisional levels just to discuss for half an hour the scope for reduction

of system losses. This will go a long way in saving the precious energy that would otherwise go heating the atmosphere. The points to be discussed are :

1. the voltages which are indicated as sources of high losses,
2. over-loaded lines,
3. extension of L.T. lines in certain transformer centres,
4. identification of location for installation of capacitors,
5. identification of new HT lines and transformer centres,
6. providing TCs at the load centres,
7. identification of new sub stations.

These are some of the areas which need to be discussed.

Of course the most important thing is to work out energy balance sheet sub station-wise, feeder-wise or sub-division-wise, which will give an indication of the health of the system.

The other day, a serious accident took place at Mahalingapur causing death of a Junior Engineer and consequently totally disrupting his family.

We have to introspect as to why such accidents take place. Accidents take place mainly on account of two factors :- (1) complacency on the part of those who take up maintenance works and (2) an error of judgement.

I have time and again stressed the need to ground the equipments effectively before any work is carried out. Even if by any chance the equipments or lines get energised due to wrong operation or for any other reason, the workmen and the staff will be protected from being killed or maimed, if grounding is made. For heaven's sake, please see that whenever you carry out any maintenance work, please ensure that the area of work or the equipment is properly grounded. If this procedure is followed, I am sure that the year

1988 will not see any more accidents to departmental staffs.

I remember having issued a circular that whenever work is being carried out, any supervisory officer will be liable to disciplinary action if work is allowed to go on without earthing properly. Please see that this system is strictly followed. **Din into the ears of Supervisors & Men, the importance of Grounding.**

Wherever I go, I see drop out cut outs with fuse wires connected with the help of stones. I think this is one of the crudest ways of providing fuse protection. I find that this habit has percolated even for new transformer centres from which I infer that the drop out cut outs, are not fixed at all.

The solution in my view is to have a new design. If any employee of the Board starting from Lineman can think of a new design, the Board will give him a reward of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty five thousand) only, if prima-facie, it is considered as a practical suggestion. The design, if any, can be sent directly to the Director (Research)/System Improvement Cell, KEB., Bangalore, where assistance will be given to develop the fuse cut outs.

NOTE

It has been reported by the vigilance that there are still some power installations where cut-outs are fixed on the line side of the energy meters. As you are all aware this gives scope for malpractice because by passing the meter is possible even if the seals are intact.

Circulars have already been issued that the sealable cut-outs, wherever provided should be only on the load side of the energy meter. But some action has to be taken in regard to existing installations. Concerted efforts should be made to remove the cut-outs to prevent any malpractice on the part of the consumer from this area. For this purpose, the following strategy may be adopted.

- a) The Meter Reader may be given a Pro-forma in which he should mark whether the cut-outs are on the line side of the meter.
- b) Once this information is known, immediate action may be taken by the Asst. Executive

Engineer, (Elect), O & M Sub Divisions to have the cut-outs removed and ensure that the leads are not accessible to the consumer.

- c) This may be done either departmentally or through Licensed Electrical Contractors.

This work may be got done within the time frame of two months and consolidated report giving the details of such modifications may be furnished by the Executive Engineers to the Zonal Chief Engineers who will consolidate the data and send the same to the Board.

QUALITY WORK GIVES YOU ENORMOUS RELIEF

I have been stressing time and again the importance of carrying out quality work whether it is transmission or distribution, though negligence is more on the distribution, side. Proper connections to the transformers, GOS., DOLO cut-outs and proper joints of the conductor at tap-off points and at mid-spans, avoiding loose spans, etc., would go a long way in reducing the interruptions and improving the image of the Board. More importantly you and your staff will have less botheration and avoid the onerous task of going out at odd hours to rectify the faults on distribution systems. You can also avoid getting uncharitable remarks from the consumers.

Somehow, I still feel that the quality aspect of work has not touched your hearts despite my stressing this point at every opportunity. The other day when I was travelling near Kolar, I met two Linemen who had gone to attend to transformer maintenance work. They told me they have used crimping sockets but when

questioned how they fix the crimping terminals without proper tools, they said innocently that they did not have the tools and hence joints were made by hammering the crimping terminals on to the conductors with stones. I am sure, they will going back to the same transformer centre very shortly to attend to loose contact trouble. I have given this example only to stress the need for doing quality work and I am sure you will, in future, give greater attention to the quality work.

However, I have instructed The Chief Engineer, Elec. (MM&P) to provide each O & M Unit crimping tools at the earliest. When these are received please ensure that these are distributed to each O & M Unit.

From a persual of the requests received by the Public Relations Officer towards issue of paper notification in respect of the schemes proposed for execution by KEB, it is observed that certain basic discrepancies exist, which in effect do not meet the requirement under the statutory rules and some times may not be valid in the strict legal sense.

It is to be noted that the notifications issued in the newspapers/ 'Gazette in respect of the proposed execution of the schemes fall under two categories. Where the cost of the schemes is less than Rs. 5 crores, they fall under section 28 of the Indian Electricity Supply Act 1948 and those exceeding Rs.5 crores come under the perview of Section 29 of the said Act. It is essential that the proper Section is quoted in the course of publication. For the guidance of all the concerned and

also to have uniformity, two formats are enclosed to this Circular in which all future notification in respect of the works covered under Section 28 and 29 of supply Act 1948 are to be used. Format 1 is for schemes costing less than Rs. 5 crores and format 2 is for schemes costing more than Rs. 5 crores. In future all the concerned officers are requested to use the appropriate format for publications in the news papers/gazettee & send the requisition to the Public Relations Officer, KEB., Bangalore, so that not only the requirement under the statutory rules is met but also there would be uniformity.

This Circular is issued for strict guidance of all the officers concerned.
