CIRCULAR

Of late instances of indiscipline among the Board employees are increasing and also there are instance of interferences in day to-day administration by the Board employees. The indiscipline and interference has been causing dislocation of Board's work and also disruption in public service. The Board has viewed very seriously such instances of indiscipline and interference as the KEB is a public service organisation. Also there are complaints about discourtesy and impoliteness exhibited by some of the employees while dealing with the consumers. The people are expressing unhappiness about the quality of power supply. The Board has also noticed lack of sincere efforts on the part of some Board officers/officials while effecting revenue collections.

It has also been noticed that finalisation of the Disciplinary enquiries already ordered is delayed for want of involvement by the Disciplinary Authorities in many cases. This has also been viewed seriously by the Board.

It is also seen that a few officers/officials do not attend promptly to the correspondence received from the Board. Board has also viewed this very seriously.

In view of the above, it is made clear that all the Board Officers/Officials should ensure the following :

- 1) Severe action should be taken against Officers/Officials who do not observe discipline and interfere in day to-day administration of the Board.
- 2) All the long standing departmental enquiries should be completed without any further delay.
- 3) The Officers/Officials dealing with public should be polite, courteous and responsive to the public. Public grievances should be attended to on priority basis.
- 4) The Officers/Officials should be available to the public during the hours prescribed for meeting the public. Instructions already issued in this regard should be followed scrupulously.
- 5) All steps should be taken to improve the better revenue collections. Instructions issued from time to time regarding effective recovery of revenue arrears and issue of disconnection memos should be followed without fail.
- 6) The tendency not to take appropriate and timely decisions at appropriate level has to be discouraged. The competent officers should take decisions without referring the cases to the Board unnecessarily.
- 7) Instructions already issued regarding the circumstances in which correspondence should be made with the Board should also be followed strictly.

Non compliance of all Circular instructions of the Board issued from time to time will render officers/officials liable for severe disciplinary action.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 79 (c) of Electricity (Supply) Act 1948 the Karnataka Electricity Board is pleased to further amend the 'Karnataka Electricity Board Employees Service Regulations' as hereunder.

1. TITLE, AND COMMENCEMENT :

- a) These rules shall be called the KEB Employees Service (Amendment) Regulations 1991.
- b) These rules shall be deemed to have come into effect from the date of publication of the Government Notification in the Karnataka Gazette viz. 28-6-90.

2. DELETION OF REGULATION 411 (B) OF KEB EMPLOYEES' SERVICE REGULATIONS :

The existing provisions under Regulations 411 (B) of the KEBESRs shall be deemed to have been omitted with effect from 1st January 1990.

3. INSERTION OF NEW RULES AS REGULATION 411 (B) AFTER REGULATION 411 (A) :

- i) The following rules shall be inserted as Regulation 411 (B) after Regulation 411 (A) of KEBESRs.

1. A Board employee shall be eligible for travel concession for journey to any place in India in accordance with the provisions of this rule.
2. The concession shall be admissible to a Board employee only once during his entire service.
3. The concession shall be admissible to a Board employee who has completed a continuous service of not less than ten years.
4. The concession shall be admissible to a Board employee during earned leave, half-pay leave, commuted leave and vacation; the duration of which shall not be less than fifteen days.
5. A Board employee may utilise the concession for himself and members of his family; the term 'family' for this purpose means a Board Employees' Wife or husband as the case may be, legitimate children not exceeding two, who are residing with and are entirely dependent upon him. Only one wife is included in the term 'family', where the spouse is also a Board employee, the concession shall be admissible to the family on the scale admissible to the husband or the wife and not both.
6. The concession shall be available for journey from the headquarters of a Board employee to any place in India, which is connected by rail or public transport system with vehicles running between fixed points at regular intervals and charging fixed rates.
7. The entitlements for journey by various modes of transport while availing the concession shall be as under :

Note.

1. Journey by Air or by I Class A/c by train or II Class AC II Tier Sleeper or by Air conditioned class shall not be the entitled mode of journey for the concession to any class of Board employees.
2. Leave travel concession for journey to any place in India shall not be admissible by a private car (owned/borrowed or hired) or bus, Van or other vehicles owned or operated on Charter by private operators.
3. Between places connected both by Railway and road, a Board employee may undertake journey either by rail or by bus, by the shortest route.
4. Between places not connected by railway or road, a Board employee may undertake journey by Sea.
8. The Board's assistance towards the cost of journey by rail/ road/ sea shall be restricted to the railway/bus/

sea fare from the headquarters of the Board employee to the place of his visit and back by the Cheapest and direct route calculated on a through ticket basis, as specified below :

- i) Journey between place connected by rail

A Single railway fare for the Board employee and each member of his family, actually accompanying him and for whom such fare is paid by the entitled class of accommodation as specified in sub-rule (7) of the fare actually paid, if lower class of accommodation is used, whichever is less.
- ii) Journey between place not connected by rail

A Single bus fare for the Board employee and each member of his family actually accompanying him and for whom such fare is paid as charged by the public transport system for the entitled class of accommodation, as specified in sub-rule (7) or the actual fare paid, if lower class of accommodation is used whichever is less.
- iii) Journey between places connected by sea

A single sea fare for the Board employee and each member of family actually accompanying him and for whom such fare is paid by the entitled class of accommodation as specified in sub-rule (7) or the fare actually paid, if lower class of accommodation whichever is less.

Note :

In the case of children between three years and twelve years one-half the fare or the fare actually charged whichever is less will be admissible.

9. No incidentals, daily allowance or any other extra allowance shall be payable as part of the concession.
10. When a Board employee and members of his family perform journey by a longer route which is not the cheapest in two different classes of accommodation, for example partly by I class to which he is entitled and partly by II Class, the entitled class rate is admissible for the corresponding portion of the shortest or the cheapest route and the lower class rate for the remaining mileage. For example, if the total distance by the longer route is 1,760 KMs and that by the shortest route is 1,600 KMs and if the Board employee concerned has travelled the initial 1,280 KMs by II Class and the remaining 480 KMs by I Class, Board's share of reimbursement of his expenditure shall be calculated as follows :

- i) Mileage for which II Class fare is admissible :

$$\frac{\text{Distance actually travelled by II Class} \times \text{Total distance by the shortest route}}{\text{Total distance by the longer route}} =$$

- ii) Mileage for which I class fare is admissible :

11. The concession shall not be admissible in the following cases :-

- i) a Board employee who has not completed continuous service of ten years. For the purpose of computing the period of continuous service of ten years, the service rendered by a Board employee from the date of his appointment to a post in pensionable establishment in accordance with the rules of recruitment shall be taken into account subject to the provisions of rule 8 (11) of these rules.
- ii) a Board employee who has already availed of the travel concession for journey to any place in India ;
- iii) a Board employee under suspension ;
- iv) a person employed as local candidate ;
- v) a person borne on work-charged establishment ;
- vi) a person borne on monthly rated establishment ;
- vii) a person paid out of contingencies ;
- viii) a person paid hourly, daily, weekly or monthly rates, wages ;
- ix) a person not in whole-time employment ;
- x) a person employed on contract ;
- ix) a person appointed on consolidated pay or salary ;
- xii) a person re-employed / re-employed on contract basis after retirement.

12. a) A Board employee who intends to avail of the concession for journey to any place in India under the provisions of this rule, shall submit an application in the form (Revised form BESR-17) annexed to these rules to the Controlling Officer through the proper channel and obtain his specific sanction before the journey is undertaken.
- b) The Controlling Officer, after verifying the records and satisfying himself that the Board employee is eligible for the concession, may accord sanction subject to availability of funds, permitting the Board employee to avail the concession.
- c) A copy of the order sanctioning the concession shall be endorsed to the concerned Head of Department and the Internal Audit.
- d) Necessary entry to the effect that the Board employee has been sanctioned for journey to any place in India shall be made in his service book and attested by the Controlling Officer, immediately after the sanction order is issued. A register shall also be maintained by the concerned Controlling Officer showing the names of the Board employees to whom the concession has been sanctioned during the financial year, the amount of advance, if any, sanctioned and the actual amount reimbursed after the final settlement of their TA bills.
13. A Board employee shall be eligible for an advance against the claim for leave travel concession for journey to any amount which the Board would have to reimburse in respect of the cost of journey to and from the place of visit.

14. a) If a Board employee who has been sanctioned TA advance does not undertake journey within 15 days from the date of drawal of the advance, the entire amount of the advance shall be refunded by him to the Board immediately.
- b) If the Board employee fails to refund the advance as required above, the Controlling Officer shall take immediate steps to recover the entire advance from the salary of the Board employee and in addition, the Board employee shall render himself liable for disciplinary action.
15. The final bill in adjustment of the advance or TA claims for journey, if no advance is drawn shall be submitted within one month from the date of completion of the journey, along with the certificate in the following form :—

CIRCULAR

It is observed by the Board that the proposals for deputation of Board employees to Govt. Departments and other organisations are not in conformity with the guide-lines issued in B.O. dated 23.2.1987 and 22.12.90. It is often noticed that the Bio-data of the employees proposed for deputation are not thoroughly verified before being sent to the Board. Therefore, in continuation to the prevailing terms and conditions of deputation of K.E.B. employees, the following guide-lines are once again brought to the notice of all concerned for strict guidance.

- 1) The minimum term of deputation shall be two years and before the expiry of this initial term of two year, the deputationist will not be repatriated under any circumstances.
- 2) The maximum term of deputation shall be five years subject to the pleasure of the Board.
- 3) Only those employees who have put in a minimum service of five years in K.E.B. shall be eligible for deputation.
- 4) Employees seeking deputation for a second time, should have invariably served in the Board atleast for a period of five years as cooling period.

- 5) No employee shall be eligible for deputation for more than two terms of deputation. The second term has to be in the higher level than the level at the time of first deputation.
- 6) Only proposals coming through proper channel shall be considered.
- 7) The borrowing department should indicate only the number of posts to be filled up by way of deputation and should not indicate names of individual employees. Names suggested by them are liable to be overlooked summarily.
- 8) While sending proposals to the Board a panel of names be sent in the ratio of 1:2. For one post 2 names of eligible employees be sent. If more employees indicate willingness then the names of those who have put in maximum years of service in the Board should be sent in this ratio.
- 9) In case the deputationist completes five years of deputation in the middle of the year, he may be continued till the completion of academic year and then he should be invariably repatriated to K.E.B.

Action taken on the guide lines should be reported to Board immediately.

CIRCULAR

Several instructions were issued in the past regarding submission of Medical Reimbursement bills for scrutiny and counter signature by the Board Senior Medical Consultants, before arranging payment. With a view to achieve improvement in the System/for speedy disposal of Medical the following instructions are issued.

1. Bills should not be forwarded to Senior Consultants, Karnataka Electricity Board without furnishing complete essentiality certificate on the bill such as, name of the patient, his/her relationship with the employee, proper diagnosis, duration of treatment and Doctor Signature and seal.
2. The bills are to be supported by prescriptions and records issued at Government Hospitals, approved hospitals/Junior Medical Consultants of Board. Prescriptions issued by Hospitals should invariably contain out patient slip in which Name, Date, Diagnosis and signature of the authorised Medical Attendant of the Hospital with his, seal, are furnished.
3. It is observed, that the chronic patients suffering from Diabetics, High Blood Pressure, I.H.D. Asthama, Epilepsy

continue medicines indefinitely for several years without being reviewed. They should be advised to get periodical assessment atleast once in Six months. Only after such exercise bills are to be entertained.

4. In spite of instructions, many employees are meeting directly the Senior Consultants of Board for counter signature which is not correct. Outside bills are to be sent to Board office and bills in respect of Bangalore Offices are to be sent through a responsible official only for counter signature wherever necessary.
5. Employees should be advised to take treatment from approved Hospitals/authorised Institutions and Karnataka Electricity Board Consultants wherever possible.
6. Records of claims of individual employees should be maintained in each office and should be made available during inspection by the superior officers/audit.

The above instructions should be scrupulously followed in future, contravention of the same will be viewed seriously. These instructions are in addition to instructions already issued by Board and Medical Attendent Rules.

There is already clear instructions from the Board the In-Patient Bills of the said Hospitals should be scrutinised in accordance with Medical Attendant Rules limiting the claims to the Government Rates wherever necessary and payment to be arranged at the respective administrative offices. SUB : Speedy disposal of pensionary benefits of Board Employees.

It has come to the notice of the Board that of-late pensionary benefits in respect of employees are not being settled even after 6 to 8 months from the date of their retirement. Time and again, Board has given instructions to all the concerned stressing the need for speedy settlement of pensionary claims. Not-withstand- ing such Circular instructions, cases of pensionary claims remaining unsettled for quite a long period are on the increase and this sort of slackness has been seriously viewed by the Board. The Board also expressed concern that no workmen should be made to suffer due to Administrative delay on the part of the Board especially the workmen who met with Electrical accident while on duty.

In this connection, attention is invited to Regulation 243 (a) of KEBESRs. The authorities dealing with pensionary claims should understand that delay on their part involves hardship to the persons concerned, At any cost a retired employee should draw his pensionary benefits on the first due date.

In cases of death or unforeseen retirements, such claims should also be processed on top priority basis and that the claims should be settled without much delay. Unless there are some specified and genuine reasons to withhold such claims.

Therefore, it is instructed again to all the concerned to take expeditious action for settlement of all the pensionary cases pending at different levels and also to settle all the pensionary cases coming up in future without inordinate delay. Inspecting Officers during the course of Inspection of Divisional Offices should review pendency of pension cases.

It may be noted that any violation of these instructions amount to fixing up of personal responsibilities on the Divisional Officers and pension sanctioning authorities. Also, if any laxity is noticed in this regard, disciplinary action would be taken against them who cause undue harassment to Retired Employees/ their families in connection with settlement of their claims.

Notwithstanding these instructions, instances of malpractices have come to the notice of the Board. In all such cases, the responsibility will be fixed primarily on the concerned staff in whose custody the Service Registers are kept. Also immediate Supervisory Officers including Head of the Office are also liable for action. To avoid such unpleasant situation, it is directed that all the officers/official concerned shall take care to see that the Service

Sub : Unauthorised use of Electricity by I.P. Set consumers to supply water to neighbouring lands.

The I.P. Sets are serviced for the bonafide consumption of electricity by registered I.P. Consumers only for pumping water to irrigate their own lands in the Survey No. s as mentioned in their I.P. Applications which is also supported by Water Right Certificate/ R.T.C. It has come to the notice of the Board that many of the I.P. Consumers are using electricity supplied to them on the above mentioned basis, to supply water to their neighbouring lands also, presumably at a rate.

The usage of electricity by I.P. Consumer to supply water to neighbouring lands, other than his own, shall have to be treated as misuse of electricity. Hence, if such cases are noticed in your jurisdiction during inspection, then such I.P. Sets shall be back billed under Commercial Tarrif (LT-3) by treating it as 'Misuse of Electricity' under Reg. 44.03 till such unauthorised water supply is stopped by the I.P. Consumers. An undertaking from them shall be obtained stating that they will not misuse electricity supplied to them by suppling water from their I.P. Sets to neighbouring lands in future. The Units for arriving at the energy misused for the above purpose shall be calculated as per the Table given under Reg.44.07 of ESR 1988.

Sub: Fixing priority for servicing of I.P. Sets.

In supersession of all the previous circulars issued for the method of fixing priority to I.P. Set works, I am directed to communicate approval for adopting the following priority norms for servicing of I.P.Sets. This will come into effect from 1-4-1991.

Application received for servicing of I.P.Sets shall be categorised under the following groups and shall be serviced in that order of group priority.

1. Group 'A': All SC/ST applicants irrespective of type of programme and loan.
2. Group 'B': All applicants coming under 100 wells programme.

Note: If the No. of work orders pending under 'A' and 'B' group are more in a sub-division, separate priority list shall be prepared among Group-A and Group-B on the basis of date of issue of work orders.

3. Group 'C': All I.P. works involving extension of service mains.

4. Group 'D' : All applications under L.I S. of State Government and Societies.
5. Group 'E' : All applicants who are loanees (other than SC/ST category) of KSCARD (PLD) Bank to be regrouped as E-1 and E-2.
- i) Group E-1 : Work requiring extension of line by 1 to 5 poles.
- ii) Group E-2 : Work requiring extension of line by 6 poles and above.
- Note : In respect of beneficiaries under KSCARD (PLD) Bank loanees requisite certificate should be issued by the concerned KSCARD (PLD) Bank.
6. Group 'F' All others not covered under the above groups shall be regrouped as F-1 & F-2
- i) Group 'F'-1 : Work requiring extension of line by 1 to 5 poles.
- ii) Group 'F'-2 : Work requiring extension of line by 6 poles and above.

The Revised roster as under shall be adopted for servicing the I.P. Sets coming under Group E and F only after the I.P. sets under groups A, B, C & D are energised in that order. Highest priority should be accorded for energisation of the I.P. Sets under SCP and 100 wells programme. Any deviation would be viewed seriously and action would be taken against those who do not comply with this circular.

The above cycle will be repeated after every 20 Estimates.

Sub : Energisation of I.P.Sets.

It has been reported that the energisation of IP set installations, involving extension of HT line and erection of Transformer centre is being delayed due to clearance of Electrical Inspectorate as per I.E.Rules. This is also due to Board Officials taking much time in completing the formalities like furnishing the necessary details in the required proforma and paying prescribe fees to Electrical Inspectorate immediately after completion of the work.

Secondly, even after observing all the above formalities by the Karnataka Electricity Board, there is delay on the part of Inspecting Officers of the Electrical Inspectorate. On account of such delays the Karnataka Electricity Board is facing the wrath of the public especially from the rural consumer in not energising their pumpsets well in time.

In this connection it is hereby instructed that in the above referred cases, immediate action has to be taken for completing the Board formalities well in time and after this, a letter is to be addressed to the jurisdictional Inspectorate authority informing them about the completion of all the formalities and request them to inspect the HT lines and Transformer Centre within a week's time in order to avoid further delay in servic-

ing the I.P.Sets. It is also to be informed to the Inspectorate Authority that if they are unable to inspect the Transformer Centre and HT lines within this period i.e., seven days, the Transformer Centre and HT lines will be charged by Karnataka Electricity Board itself.

However, such lines and Transformer Centres shall be inspected by the jurisdictional (Operation & Maintenance) Executive Engineers, Electrical and can approve to charge them provided all the works are completed strictly as per I.E.Rules and Supply Regulations. The Executive Engineers, Electrical, shall judiciously exercise this powers.

SUB : Installation of IP Sets with ISI Marking.

It has come to the notice of the Board that I. P. sets are being serviced indiscriminately without verifying whether the pumpset installed bear an ISI mark or conform to IS Specification No. 38-1975, reaffirmed in 1984. In this connection your attention is drawn to the Regulation No. 14.01 of ESR 1988 wherein it has been specifically mentioned that all materials and equipments having ISI marks shall only be used by the consumer. If such materials are not available, materials conforming to ISS shall have to be used. Your attention is also drawn to Regn. No. 6.06 where the Board has reserved the right to prescribe the size, capacity, quality, efficiency and type of pumpset and also to the Regulation 4.28 that the installation shall comply with IE Rules, Rule Nos. 50, 51 and 61 for LT installations and Rule Nos. 63 and 64 for HT installations.

The following guidelines issued in this regard are to be strictly followed from 1-5-1991 :

1. Only pumpsets with ISI marking or conforming to ISS 7538-1975 shall be used by the I. P. applicants.
2. In case the work orders have already been issued and the pumpsets installed before 1-5-1991, they shall be serviced even though they do not have ISI markings.

3. Wherever power sanction is communicated in future, it should be clearly indicated that the prospective consumer should purchase and instal pumpsets with ISI markings or should conform to ISS, failing which the service shall not be arranged.
4. Prospective consumers who have registered their applications and not yet submitted the completion-cum-test report should be immediately informed to purchase and instal pumpsets with ISI mark or conforming to ISS failing which their installations will not be serviced.

If any consumer has purchased the pumpset before the intimation has reached him but has not yet submitted the Completion-cum-Test Report, approval of the concerned O & M EEs., should be obtained before servicing of the installation. The Executive Engineer Elecls., should verify the purchase bills of the pumpsets before according approval. Any deviation from the above instructions shall be severely dealt with.

Regarding

Please refer to the Board Circulars of even No. dated 20-12-1990 and 16/22 3.1991, wherein instructions were given for collection of entire arrears of Additional Security Deposit (additional 3 MMD) amount in one lumpsum/three instalments on or before 15.5.1991 from all the installations (except domestic consumers) by enforcing rules of disconnection. In the circular dated 22.3.1991, it is also informed that the powers delegated to Executive Engineers (EI)/Asst. Ex. Engrs (EI) for collection of additional 3 MMD amount in instalments vide Board Order of even No. dated 6.4.1988 ceases to be in operation for the present.

The above time limit for collection of additional amount towards 3 MMD has been now extended upto 31.5.1991 as confirmed to the Zonal Chief Engineers vide this office Telex message dated 16.5.1991. The extended time limit is applicable only to those consumers who have not paid the deposit amount claimed by the Karnataka Electricity Board prior to the year 1991, awaiting Court's judgment. The deposit amount due from these consumers are to be collected in full along with interest by enforcing rules of disconnection on or before 31-5-91. But in respect of

Textile and Labour Oriented Industries which have been declared as Sick and considered by the High Level Committee of BIFR (Board for Industrial Finance and Reconstruction) for Rehabilitation purposes and have not paid the deposit amount till now on account of their sickness/anticipating reliefs from Govt., be excluded from this time limit and their cases are to be referred to the Board through the respective Zonal Chief Engineers for considering their cases individually.

Further, in respect of additional 3 MMD claimed during this year ie., 1991 and onwards, the Executive Engineers (EI)/ Asst. Ex. Engineers may exercise their powers as delegated vide Board Order of even No. dated 6.4.1988 in granting instalment facilities, in case the consumers express difficulty in paying the amount in one lumpsum.

Sirs,

During his recent visit to one of the O & M Division Office, the Chairman, KEB, has observed the following :

1) In many of the cases, the payments made by the consumer towards the arrears due are being adjusted towards revenue portion instead of first adjusting towards interest portion and then to revenue arrears.

The incorrect adjustment has resulted in continuance of interest arrears in the ledger accounts which is being disputed by the consumers. Hence as per Regulation No. 30.07 of ESR 1988 all payments should be first set off against the interest and tax component of the arrears only, if excess amount is available it can be credited to revenue arrears portion.

2) The arrears due from TMC/CMCs and Corporations and Mandal Panchayats are on the increase.

The field officers including Zonal Chief Engineers, are required to correspond with the concerned authorities for clearance

of arrears at least in instalments. In view of the heavy accumulation of arrears, no extension of street lights may be permitted to any Municipalities who are having arrears. However, this is not applicable to the extension of street lights to Harijan Basthis.

3) The progress achieved by the Divisions in revenue collection are not satisfactory.

The Deputy Controller of Accounts and Accounts Officers are to be made personally responsible for pursuing revenue collection and reduction of stores inventory. In cases of slackness on the part of any ministerial staff, the Deputy Controller of Accounts may explain in writing to the respective Superintending Engineers, Electrical, for taking appropriate action.

I am directed to request you to take immediate action on the above observations and furnish a compliance report to this office at your earliest.

All those installations which have been disconnected may be reconnected immediately. A monthly statement of arrears of these installations may be sent to the FA & CAO by the Divisional Officers for any future course of action.

If there are any appeal cases pending before the local courts under your jurisdiction, they may be got vacated.

Sub : Disconnection of installations for non-payment of monthly bills and arrears - Regarding.

Ref : Board Circular No.KEB/B20/5605/89-90 dt.18-5-91

Reference is invited to Board Circular cited above wherein instructions have been issued for prompt disconnection of installations in case of non-payment of monthly bills and arrears.

It has again come to the notice of the Board that timely action is not being taken as per Regulation 30.06 of KEB ESR 88 for disconnection of defaulting installations inspite of strict instructions from the Board. The field officers are not at all evincing interest in collecting Board's revenues resulting in huge accumulation of arrears. Non-collection of regular Bills and arrears has adversely affected the financial position of the Board and the accumulation of arrears due to non-payment of monthly bills should be discouraged strictly in future.

Therefore, it is hereby instructed to enforce rules of disconnection very strictly in case of non-payment of monthly bills as well as arrears in respect of all categories of private installations even though they are labour oriented. This is in partial modification to the instructions given in Board Circular No.B13 1430/90-91 dated 2-5-1991.

Further, it is instructed to discontinue instalment facilities to consumers in collection of Board dues other than security deposits.

As already instructed vide Circular under reference, Board guidelines may be followed in respect of State & Central Govt. installations, water supply & street light installations of CMS/TMC/Mandal Panchayats etc.

Any lapses observed in this regard on the part of officers/officials will be viewed seriously.

As per Regulations 30.06 of ESR-1988 the Board will have to serve on the consumer seven clear days notice for disconnection, if the payment is not received from the consumer within the due dates mentioned in the Regulation.

It is brought to the notice of the Board that many of the officers are not issuing this seven days notice to the consumer before disconnection, causing much agitation among consumer public. The Board is receiving representation from the consumers that their installations have been disconnected without issuing 7 days notice. Disconnecting the installations without issuing 7 days notice, for non payment of bills, within the prescribed period, violates section 24 of JE Act 1910.

It is therefore, strictly instructed to issue a seven clear days notice to the consumers before disconnection for non receipt of the bill amount within the prescribed period.

applicants falling under group E & F. Next roster was to be prepared after completing the previous roster. Now it is hereby instructed to prepare only two rosters of 20 estimates each at a time totalling to 40 estimates and display it on the Notice Board. After completing the works of about 30 estimates another two lists of 20 estimates each prepared as per roster should be displayed on the Notice Board. These instructions shall not apply to applicants belonging to SC/ST, SCP and 100 wells programme falling under group A & B, since they have to be serviced on topmost priority as and when they come.

Further, the following relaxation is made for servicing the I.P. sets in order to achieve the target during the year 1991-92 only.

- 1) I. P. Sets which can be serviced with extension of service main only can be serviced immediately without bringing it under roster.
- 2) In order to achieve the target whenever there is a short fall, the Zonal Chief Engineers, Electricity, can relax works involving upto 5 poles, if found necessary, and service them as and when they come without bringing it under roster.
- 3) All sanctioned work orders pending to be operated as on 31-3-1991, shall be completed first, before taking up current year's works.

As per Regulation 8.10 of ESR 88, the capacity of any individual machinery/equipment installed/connected should not be more than the Contract Demand. This restriction on the capacity will also apply to the main transformer installed by the H. T Consumer at the point of supply. The Board while communicating power sanction to the prospective H. T. Consumers is including a clause specifying that the transformer capacity to be installed by the consumer should be equal to sanctioned Contract Demand or of next standard rating as per IS 2026 (Part-I) 1977.

However, it has come to the notice of the Board that some of the Divisional Officers and Zonal CEEs are not specifying such a clause while communicating power sanction. It is therefore strictly instructed to SPECIFICALLY MENTION THE CAPACITY OF THE MAIN STEP DOWN TRANSFORMER TO BE INSTALLED BY THE CONSUMER AT THE POINT OF SUPPLY limiting the capacity to sanctioned Contract Demand or next standard rating capacity as per IS 2026 (Part-I) 1977.

SUB : H. T. Installations-Reading Meters and issue of Spot Bills-Regarding.

As per Regulation 30.02 of Electricity Supply Regulations 1988, the Board will FURNISH to the Consumer EVERY MONTH or at such intervals as prescribed by the Board from time to time the

POWER SUPPLY BILLS for the actual or in its absence, the assessed demand and/or consumption either at the SPOT-OR BY POST. In other words, the Board will issue power supply bills to the consumer every month either at the SPOT OR BY POST.

The issuing of spot bill for L. T. installations is already in vogue in all the Sub-divisions. In respect of H. T. installations, the bills are prepared in the office after the Meters are read by the jurisdictional Officers and delivered to the consumers in person or by post. Where as in Bangalore O & M Circle, where large No. of H. T. installations are concentrated, the system of issuing spot bills for H. T. installations is already introduced. The jurisdictional Officers of the Sub-divisions along with the Asst. Accounts Officers/Senior Assistants are reading the meters on first and Second day of every month by issuing the spot bills to the H. T. consumers. This has been done in order to collect the energy charges in the immediate next month of the energy sold/to collect the bill amount during the same month in which the bill has been issued. From the consumers point of view also, the doubts raised by the consumers are clarified on the spot by enlightening the latest tariff and regulations of the Board which avoids unnecessary correspondences.

As this system has proved its worthiness and is working satisfactorily in Bangalore Circle, it has been decided to adopt the said system of reading the meters of H. T. installations on first/second day-of-every month and issuing of SPOT BILLS in all O & M Circles also with effect from 1st November 1991. As a preliminary work for implementation of this system, the jurisdictional Divisional Officers/Sub-divisional Officers shall have to make arrangements for pooling up Officers/Vehicles so as to take meter reading on first/second day of every month in future.

Further, the H.T. consumers will have to be informed the change in the meter reading dates as on the above dates and this may be done while taking the meter readings in November 1991.

Any clarification in the matter shall be obtained from the concerned Superintending Engineers/Zonal Chief Engineers and a compliance report in implementing the system should be sent to the Board through the Zonal Chief Engineers on or before 30th November 1991 without fail.

NOTIFICATION

It has come to the notice of the Board that many Hotels, Kalyana Mantapas and other buildings, who have availed permanent power supply on H.T. or on L.T. basis, are letting out a portion of their building and in some cases entire building temporarily for the purpose of sale of Garments, House-hold articles etc., and the electricity is supplied to such areas from their permanent connection.

It is also observed that in some of these buildings loose wires are drawn for providing additional illumination. This act, clearly violates the purpose for which permanent power supply was availed by them, and they are liable to be back-billed under Regulation 44.02 and 44.06 of ESR, 1988. For any violation found after this Notification, action will be taken against such consumers as per prevailing Rules. In case power supply is required for any purpose other than the purpose for which permanent power supply was availed, then a separate service under temporary supply shall be obtained by the consumers.

With reference to the above, I am directed to state that the matter has been examined in detail and to clarify that under Clause 'Application of the provision of the Act, the rules, the Supply Act and the Regulations mentioned in all the power supply agreements it is clearly stated that 'In all matters not herein Specifically provided for, the provision of the Act, the Rules, the Supply Act and the Regulations as amended from time to time shall apply'.

In other words, in cases where there is no specific provision in the Agreement in respect of any matters, the provisions made in the Act/Supply Rules and the Electricity Supply Regulations will prevail. Sub :- Installation of captive power plants by the new entrepreneurs.

While communicating power sanction by the Single Window Agency/High Power Committee, the new entrepreneurs are being insisted upon to instal captive power plants of suitable capacity depending on total power sanctioned. It is observed that eventhough the entrepreneurs have not installed the captive plants their installations are being serviced by the field officers without insisting on the same. The new entrepreneurs are being intimated by the single Window Agency/High Power committee to instal the captive plants to see that the total burden on the grid is reduced. Non-insistance of the installation of the captive plants while servicing by the field officers can be viewed as a serious lapse on their part. Eventhough some of the entrepreneurs have installed the captive plants for the formality sake they will not be using it regularly.

The Field Officers are hereby strictly instructed to see that captive plants of suitable capacities as intimated by the Single Window Agency are installed by the entrepreneurs before servicing and they should insist to use it regularly by periodical inspection and also during monthly readings without fail. Any lapse will be viewed seriously.

Sub:—Energy conservation guide lines for
offices and buildings.

In view of increasing energy shortage and scarcity of resources for increasing the available capacity, the option available for bridging the gap is to aim for optimal energy management and conservation.

In this connection, the Cabinet Secretary, Govt. of India has stated that by simple house keeping measures, it is possible to reduce the energy consumption by about 10%.

A copy of the guide lines suggested by him for energy conservation is enclosed herewith. These guidelines shall be strictly followed.

ENERGY CONSERVATION GUIDE-LINES FOR OFFICE AND BUILDINGS

A) LIGHTING AND FANS

- i) Switch Off lights and fans whenever not needed especially during lunch breaks etc ;
- ii) Use more Natural lights in the Office buildings wherever possible by lifting curtains, venitian blinds etc ;
- iii) Switch off redundant lights in stair cases, toilets, corridors, lobbies etc ;
- iv) Try changing Office Lay-out in order to use maximum natural light.
- v) Clean lamp fittings and luminaires and keep them dust free ;
- vi) Replace CLS incandescent lamps with fluorescent tubes. A 40 Watts tube light gives twice as much light as a 100 Watts incandescent bulb.
- vii) Replace fused fluorescent lamps with only 36 Watts slimline fluorescent tubes which save 10% energy compared to conventional fluorescent lamps ;
- viii) Install electronic chokes for fluorescent tubes which save energy. Conventional chokes consume 12 to 14 watts whereas electronic chokes consume 3 to 5 Watts of energy ;
- ix) Replace conventional fan regulators with electronic regulators which save 10% energy ;

- x) Wherever a group of incandescent lamps are provided in places such as lobbies, conference rooms, etc; for better aesthetics, electronic dimmers should be used to minimise energy consumption.
- xi) In Open areas such as yards, front gates, lawns, etc; high pressure sodium vapour lamps should be used instead of high pressure mercury vapour lamps;
- xii) Use light colour paints for interior walls.

B) AIR CONDITIONING, COOLING AND HEATING

- i) Air conditioners are major energy guzzlers. An AC switched off for one hour can keep a 40 Watt tube light on for 50 Hours.
- ii) Minimise the use of Air-Conditioners by switching off when nobody is in the room and also switching off say, about half an hour before the Office closing hour.
- iii) Do not use fans while Air-conditioners are used. Use any one of them; not both at the same time.
- iv) Ensure proper sealing of windows and doors in Air-conditioned Rooms to prevent loss off air outside;
- v) Maintain correct temperature in the room. Over-cooling should be avoided. Adjust/Repair the thermostats, if necessary;
- vi) Clean the Air-conditioner filters on a weekly basis.
- vii) Provide automatic door closers or Air-curtains.

- viii) Wherever centralized Air-conditioners are used, try to reduce the Air-conditioning loads in corridors, lobbies, etc., by partial isolation.
- ix) Use solar control film in windows to minimise solar heat radiation into the Air-Conditioned Rooms ;
- x) The cooling towers should be properly maintained in order to reduce the load on the energy requirement on the centralized Air-conditioning system.
- xi) Water cooler thermostats should be set properly to avoid overcooled water ;
- xii) Clean the reflectors of radiant type room heaters regularly.
- xiii) Misuse of room heaters, such as heating lunch boxes, etc ; should be avoided.

HOW TO GO ABOUT ENERGY CONSERVATION

The above are general guide lines in various energy using areas as applicable to Office buildings. For a successful implementation of Energy Conservation programme, the commitment and attention of the Chief Executive of the office is vital. The Chief Executive may appoint a nodal person to monitor the implementation of identified energy conservation opportunities. For achieving energy savings by house-keeping measures, it will be necessary that the Chief Executive motivates his junior colleagues and staff and ensures their full Co-operation. It is possible that some Government Officers/Buildings might have qualified Engineers in their staff establishment. In such cases they should be associated with the Energy Conservation programme from the beginning. By adopting this method, the organisation can achieve sizable energy savings by itself.

However, since there are technicalities in many cases, it is recommended that the Chief Executive engages professional Energy Audit Consultants. By Energy Audit we mean complete analysis of energy usage with reference to efficiency and quantifying the energy savings by the suggested measures. Energy Audit would also identify energy savings on the basis of cost benefit analysis and provide the detailed implementation methodology. Because of their professional expertise, Energy Audit Consultants support would be highly valuable for the success of the Energy Conservation programme.

It is possible that you can achieve upto 15% reduction in your energy bills, by making energy conservation as a part of office culture.

Now that payment of arrears of DA, HRA & CCA accrued upto November 1990 as per Board Order No. KEB/B16/3888/89-90 Dated 3-12-1990 and Board Order No. B16/1882/90-91 Dated 3-12-1990 is released for payment, vide Board Order No. KEB/B16/3888/89-90 Dated 3-6-1991, doubts are being expressed by some of the Pay Drawing Officers as to whether this 2% towards building fund has to be recovered from these arrears also.

It is hereby clarified that 2% towards Building Fund has to be recovered from the arrears for the period from 1-4-89 to 31-3-90 only. The Board Order of even no. dtd. 23-6-1990 is very clear on this aspect that 2% recovery will have to be done at the time of paying arrears to the workmen consequent to revision of Pay & Allowances and fixation of pay with effect from 1-4-89. Since the benefits of revision of pay & allowances formed part of pay from 1-4-1990 itself, amounts to be paid for the period after 1-4-1990 cannot be considered as arrears for this purpose.

2. As per Cadre & Recruitment Regulations 1976, an Assistant with not less than 8 years service in the Board is eligible for promotion as Senior Assistant, provided he fulfils other conditions also.
3. Letter No. KEB/WLIC/178/77-78 Dated 7.3.1981 from the Secretary, clarifying that a person should have put in 8 years service as Assistant in Board to become eligible for promotion to the cadre of Senior Assistant, and that all service rendered in other Circle would be considered for promotion.
4. Letter No. KEB/B16/4739/80-81 Dated 10.4.1981, Board staying the promotions, Hence, promotions were not effective for a certain period.
5. Sri S. Nagaraja, Asssistant, was not given promotion as Senior Assistant on the plea that he becomes junior-most Assistant in Mysore Circle vide Ref. 1. But his junior was promoted as Senior Assistant.
6. The matter was then referred to the Deputy Labour Commissioner, Hassan, for Conciliation by the Union (659) vide IDA/SR. 7/81-82. The proceedings were closed on the assurance of the Management that the issue of Sri. S. Nagaraja

and all other similar cases are being taken up before the Board for proforma promotion from the date, their juniors were promoted as Senior Assistant, subject to other conditions of eligibility.

7. Res. No. BM. 612/18256 Dated 2.12.1991 Resolved to give proforma promotion to Sri S. Nagaraja, Assistant, as Senior Assistant and to create supernumerary post of Senior Assistant from 29.1.1981 to 23.6.1982 ; to permit Chief Engineer, Electy., (General) to give proforma promotion to 25 other similarly placed employees subject to fulfilment of other conditions and to give financial benefits due to them.

8. In the above circumstances, the following orders.

Order Nor KEB/CLO/B14/7375/80-81,

Bangalore, Dated : 28.12.1991

Sri S. Nagaraia, Assistant, who took mutual transfer to another Circle was placed as junior most Assistant in the Circle. When his junior was promoted as Senior Assistant, he represented his case to the Chief Engineer, Electy. (General). The doubt regarding counting of entire services irrespective of Circles was referred to the Board.

The Board clarified vide this office letter dtd. 7.3.81. Meanwhile, the matter was taken up before the Deputy Labour Commissioner, Hassan, for conciliation by the Union (659) on the plea that the juniors have been promoted as Senior Assistant, and the service rendered by the Assistants in other Circles has been ignored. Since the Board assured before the Deputy Labour Commissioner, Hassan, that needful action will be taken for proforma promotion from the date juniors were promoted as Senior Assistant subject to fulfilment of other conditions, the Conciliation proceedings were closed. The Chief Engineer, Electy. (General had)

intimated vide his letter No. AO/AOE/AAO.2/EA8/3090 Dated 12.5.1989 that there are 25 other similar cases and that promotions to the Senior Assistants cadre was given by counting the entire length of service, irrespective of the Circles, considering the date of entry into service and minimum qualifications. As a result, around 667 Assistants were promoted after Board clarification dated 7.3.1981.

In the circumstances stated above, Board is pleased to accord approval for counting the entire service rendered in KEB by Sri S. Nagaraja and 25 other Assistants (as per annexure) for including their service rendered in other Circles also, for the purpose of promotion as Senior Assistants subject to R&P Regulations. Hence, the Chief Engineer, Electy. (General) is empowered to accord proforma promotions to these Assistants as Senior Assistants duly observing R&P Regulations by creating supernumerary posts of Senior Assistant wherever necessary and allowing them the consequential benefits.

CIRCULAR

In spite of Circulars issued by Chief Vigilance Officer, vide his No. KEB/CVC/CYS 12/87 dated 17.2.87 and No. KEB/CVO/CYS 28/88 dt. 6.4.88 it is regretted to note that 90% of the H.T. installations do not comply with the instructions issued in the above Circulars. This gives ample scope for the consumers especially H.T. Consumers to misuse of electricity resulting in loss of revenue to the Board. It is once again reiterated that the incoming leads and the outgoing leads from the H.T. metering cubicle should be fully insulated from the entry/exit bushing terminals upto the KEB incoming GOS atleast to a minimum extent of 2 mtrs. on either side by using sticky cambric tape or quick setting Epoxy Compound or insulating tapes of Dr. Beck & Co., make, or similar make to prevent consumers from shunting the entry and exit leads thereby bypassing C.T. circuits.

Wherever consumers PTs and CTs have been used for metering purposes, the CTs and PTs terminal boxes should be sealed with Vigilance/RT/MRT/MT seals and there should not be any scope for the consumers to meddle with secondary circuits. Wherever withdrawal type of PTs are provided they should also be sealed in such a way that the consumer is prevented by withdrawing the PTs. Wherever PT fuses are provided the same should be made through by PT chamber. These should be sealed with appropriate seals.

These measures will go a long way in preventing theft/misuse of energy by the consumers.

There are only 2100 HT installations in the State out of which about 450 installations are Government installations of either Government of Karnataka or Govt. of India who may not have any motivation for illegal extraction of energy

The instructions given above may be done in a phased time-bound manner concentrating first on installations which are having a contract Demand of more than 500 KVA and in a course of time of another 3 to 4 months all the H.T. installations should be covered.

The instructions should be followed up with all earnestness and monthly progress report in achieving this should be sent to Board/Chief Vigilance Officer divisionwise for monitoring.

Any laxity in this regard will be viewed seriously and appropriate action will be taken against the concerned which may please be noted.

It is hereby made clear that such of those officers who fail to follow roster system in future and do not follow strictly the Board orders issued from time to time will render themselves liable for severe disciplinary/penal action.

All Controlling Officers should verify the representation of SC/ST employees in all categories under their jurisdiction. It is their duty to ascertain correctness of representation of these categories and take appropriate action to fill up the short fall or back log as the case may be. The short fall or back log may also be promptly brought to the notice of the Recruiting Agency.

The Recruiting Agencies should ensure that all Government Orders/Circulars for the benefit of SC/ST categories of employees are adopted by the Board. All the administrative officers should maintain a "GUARD FILE" containing copies of Board/Govt. orders on reservation policy and keep the file ready for reference in their office. The Government Orders/Circulars not yet adopted by the Board may be brought to the notice of the Board for consideration.

Board is pleased to temporarily enhance the percentage of reservation to 20% in respect of Scheduled Castes and 5% in respect of Scheduled Tribes in the case of direct recruitment of SC/ST Employees in respect of the cadres where there is a shortfall in the reserved percentages of 15% for Scheduled Castes candidates and 3% for scheduled Tribes candidates till such time those minimum percentages of 15% and 3% are reached.

2. Board is further pleased to direct that the provisions of this order shall apply to direct recruitment to all posts the process of selection for which has not been completed. It is not necessary to call for fresh applications, but applications already received shall be considered. For implementing the provisions of this order, if it is found that some more persons are eligible for interview, they may be interviewed and selections made thereafter. It is not necessary to interview candidates who have already been interviewed. The Recruiting Committees / Authorities of Board shall take action accordingly.
3. The enhanced percentage of reservation in favour of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and the roster of 100 vacancies appended to this order will be operative until the representation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the respective cadres reach 15% and 3% respectively. On each occasion of notifying the number of vacancies to the recruiting agencies for direct recruitment, the appointing authority shall make assessment of actual representation of SC/ST in the cadre for which direct recruitment is proposed to be made and inform the recruiting agencies depending on their actual representation then prevailing, whether SC/ST candidates should be recruited to the extent 20% and 5% respectively.
4. For the purpose of making reservation and for calculating the number of vacancies to be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes, the roster of 100 vacancies appended to this order shall be followed.
5. The Board will review the position in different cadres from time to time in order to monitor the level of representation of SC/ST and make such adjustment/orders as may be necessary.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF KARNATAKA

Sub : Classification of Backward classes for the purpose of providing benefits of reservation of appointments and posts in the State Civil Services under Article 16 (4) of the Constitution of India-Recruitment of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes-Special Measures Ba-on dereservation in direct recruitment vacancies.

Read :

G. O. No. DPAR 28 SBC 86 dated 12-12-1986.

Preamble :

Rule 8 of the Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977 provides, inter-alia, that appointments or posts shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes to such extent and in such manner as may be specified by the Government under clause (4) of Article 16 of the Constitution of India. Accordingly 15% of the Vacancies have been reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes and 3% of the vacancies have been reserved for the member of the Scheduled Tribes in direct recruitment to the State Civil Services, for some year past.

Government have been taking steps from time to time to ensure that the requisite percentage of 15 and 3 reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Sheduled Tribes respectively is utilised as early as possible. Among the steps taken in that direction allotting roster points 1 and 2 for the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes respectively in the reservation roster, setting up of an Employment Cell, Directorate of Social Welfare to inspect unit offices to verify the proper implementation of Government Order's

regarding reservation for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, arranging Seperate interviews for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes in recruitments to avoid unfavourable comparison of candidates, fixing the enhanced maximum age limit for recruitment by five years, obtaining periodical reports from the fields departments regarding implementation of the reservation orders, maintenance of vacancy register to watch implementation of the reservation orders and constitution of a High Level Committee under the Chairmanship of the Chief Minister to oversee the implementation of standing orders on reservation in-favour of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes are some of the important steps which the Government took from time to time.

In the year 1984 Government reviewed the position and came to the conclusion that more drastic steps are needed to accelerate the utilisation of the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Accordingly, orders were issued in G. O. No. DPAR 27 SBC 84 dated 25-9-1984 directing that the percentage of reservation in direct recruitment in all the cadres in which representation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was less than 15% and 3% should be enhanced to 20% and 5% respectively till their representation in each cadre reached 15% and 3%. For this purpose a seperate roster was also prescribed.

A further review has now been made to ascertain the actual percentage of employees belonging to scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State Civil Services. According to the latest figure available as on 1-1-1988 the overall percentage of employees belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State Civil Services is 14.27 and 2.40 respectively. Government, therefore consider that it is necessary to take further steps to give greater fillip to the process of utilisation of quota for reservation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes with the goal of reaching the extent of utilisation to 15% and 3% respectively. Accordingly the following orders are **issued**.

GOVERNMENT ORDER NO. DPAR 19 SBC 89, BANGALORE
DATED 12-7-1989.

1. The Vacancies respectively classified for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes but not filled by appointment from each of such Categories due to Non-availability of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes in all the direct recruitments made on or after **1-1-1986** so far, shall be categorised as '**backlog**' vacancies and one attempt shall be made for recruiting suitable-candidates belonging only to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes through the appropriate recruiting agencies. A vacancy classified and carried forward should be counted as one vacancy only for inclusion in the backlog irrespective of the number of times that vacancy was carried forward. If the number of candidates selected during such attempt against the backlog is more than the number of vacancies actually available, the vacancies arising in future shall be first utilised for exhausting list of candidates selected during such attempt. However, if the number of candidates selected during such attempt is less than the number required to clear the backlog, the-unutilised portion of the backlog vacancies shall be carried forward as backlog vacancies to the next direct-recruitment.
2. In the next direct recruitment, the vacancies-released for that recruitment (called the 'current' vacancies and the 'backlog' vacancies both shall be advertised but keeping 'current' and 'backlog' vacancies as the two distinct groups. While doing so the 'Current' vacancies should be classified according to the orders in force regarding classification of vacancies for - Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other backward Classes. The 'backlog' vacancies shall not be classified again but they shall be continued to be earmarked for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes as per earlier classification and the vacancies be filled accordingly.

3. The vacancies classified for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes out of the 'Current Vacancies' together with the earlier backlog vacancies, if any, which remain un-utilised during any direct recruitment shall constitute the backlog for the next direct-recruitment. The process should continue in the subsequent direct recruitments also.
4. If after making the attempt referred to in para 1, the backlog vacancies are not exhausted within three years or after three direct recruitments whichever is later, then the vacancy earmarked in the backlog for scheduled Castes-should be filled by Scheduled Tribes and vice-versa in the subsequent direct recruitment if suitable candidates belonging to the category for which the vacancy is reserved are not available. Under no other circumstances the vacancies should be dereserved and they shall remain vacant, vacant, until candidates of the category are available.
5. Carrying forward and dereservation of the vacancies that remain vacant due to non-availability of candidates belonging to Backward Group-A, Backward - Group-B, Backward Group-C, Backward Group-D and Backward Group-E for the vacancies reserved for the respective categories shall continue to be done according to the Government Orders dated 12-12-1986.
6. This Government Order shall have effect notwithstanding anything in paras 9, 10 and 11 of the Government Order No. DPAR 28 SBC 86, dated 12.12.1986. This Government Order shall come into force with immediate effect and shall apply also to recruitments still pending i.e. where the select lists have not yet been published. The select lists already published shall be implemented as if this Government Order has not been issued
7. This order shall also apply to the following organisations :—
 - i) Companies, Boards, Corporations etc., established under the Companies Act or other Acts or Rules & Regulations, owned or controlled by the Government.

- ii) All institutions other than minority institutions which are in receipt of Grant-in-Aid, or assistance from Government Here 'Grant-in Aid' or 'Assistance' means/ includes financial and /or other assistance given by Government.

Doubts are being raised as to whether in cases where no recruitment was made during the period from 1.1.1986 to 12.7.1989 the vacancies classified for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in earlier recruitments and carried forward for them for recruitments during the year 1986 in accordance with the orders in force at the relevant time are to be taken as dereserved. It is not intended to dereserve any vacancies otherwise admissible to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during the said period. It is therefore directed that the vacancies classified for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the

years 1984 and 1985 and carried forward for recruitment during the year 1986 in accordance with the standing orders then in force i.e. as on 1.1.1986 shall also be included in the vacancies categorised as backlog vacancies, irrespective of whether or not recruitments were made during the period from 1.1.1986 to 12.7.1989.

CIRCULAR

Sub I Implementation of Government Orders/Roster systems in appointments/Promotions of SC/ST Candidates.

Government have issued orders, circular instructions regarding reservation to any office in a civil service of State of Karnataka or to civil post under the State of Karnataka or to a service or post in an estt. in Public Sector for the members of the SC, STs and other Backward Classes to such extent and in such manner as may be specified from time to time in the order made by the Government under Clause (4) of Art, 16 of the Constitution of India. Very recently the Karnataka SCs, STs and other Backward Classes (Reservation of appointment, etc.) Act, 1990 has been passed in both the Houses of the Legislature. If any appointing authority makes an appointment or any authority making admission to a course of study in a University or any educational institution makes admission in contravention of the provisions of the Act or rules made thereunder, shall be punishable with fine, which may extend upto Rs. 1000/and imprisonment not exceeding 6 months. Every appointing authority and every authority making admission to a course of study in a University or an educational institution shall maintain, such records in such form and such manner as may be prescribed by Government.

Several complaints have been received from the SC/ST candidates Dalitha Sangharsha Samithi representatives on the non-implementation of GOs/roster system in Government departments/

Public Undertakings/Organisations. This is a very serious matter which requires the personal attention of the Heads of Government Departments/Organisations/Public Undertakings.

All the concerned are hereby requested to strictly follow the GOs/Circular instructions and roster system in appointments and promotions of the SC/ST candidates in all the Governments Departments/Organisations/Public Undertakings. Disciplinary/penal action shall be taken against those who fail to follow the roster system in future. The concerned administrative Secretaries are requested to issue necessary instructions to the Heads. of Deptts subordinates under their control..

m) The following procedure shall be adopted for the selection of Driver Grade-II under direct recruitment quota:-

i) From among the applications received from various sources, a list of candidates shall be prepared on the basis of percentage of total marks secured in VII standard examination in the order of merit.

Note : If two or more candidates have equal percentage, the order of merit, shall be based on their age and person/s older in age shall be placed higher in the order of merit.

ii) A practical test shall be conducted for the eligible candidates and the candidates shall be called for practical test in the ratio of 1:10 in the order of merit (i.e. 10 times the No. of vacancies). If the No. of eligible candidates is less than 10 times the No. of vacancies to be filled then the recruiting authority shall call all the eligible candidates for practical test.

The maximum marks for the practical test shall be 25 (Twenty five). This test should be conducted by the selection committee with the Assistance of Regional Transport Officers. In this test the candidates shall be tested in respect of driving, knowledge in vehicle parts, Road signals etc.

- iii) An oral interview shall be conducted only for such of the candidates who pass in the above practical test scoring marks of not less than 40%. The maximum marks prescribed for the oral interview is 25 (Twenty five). In this test the candidates shall be interviewed covering General Knowledge, Reading and writing.
 - iv) The recruiting Authority shall on the basis of the aggregate of the percentage of the total marks secured in the practical test and oral interview and taking into consideration the orders, in force relating to reservation of posts for SC/ST and other Backward classes prepare in the order of merit a list of candidates eligible for the appointment.
- iii. Amendent to Sl. No. 3-Driver Grade-II under Group-X-Transport of Karnataka Electricity Board Recruitment and Promotion of Employees of the Board Service Regulations 1969.

The existing provisions with regard to the method of Recruitment and minimum qualifications is amended as detailed in the annexure appended hereto.

The consolidated amount of increase in Dearness Allowance including the Dearness Allowance sanctioned with effect from 1st July 1990 to be invested in National Savings Certificate VIII issue from July 1991 shall be as shown in annexure-II of this Board Order. Such monthly investments shall be in multiples of Rs. 100/- and fractions thereof shall be paid in cash. The amount to be invested, in respect of a particular month, shall invariably be drawn in the same month, as for example, the amount to be invested in respect of the month of July 1991 shall invariably be drawn in that month and invested promptly. In order to ensure such prompt investment the Pay Drawing Officers and self Drawing Officers shall, on the Pay bills of the month succeeding the month in respect of which the amount for investment is drawn, certify to the effect that the amount has been invested in National Savings Certificate.

5. The orders and procedure for Investment of the arrears of the Dearness Allowance accrued upto June 91 for all the employees will be issued separately.
6. In the case of an employee who ceases to be in service due to death while in service or retirement during the period from 1st January 1991 to 30th June 1991 the Dearness Allowance admissible under this Order shall be paid in cash.
7. These Orders will apply to the Full Time Board Employees who are on Regular Time Scales of pay and will not apply to the T.T.R./Casual Labourers, who are working on Daily Wages.
8. For the purpose of these orders, the term Basic pay means pay drawn by a Board Employee in the scale of pay applicable to the post held by him and includes :—
 - a) Stagnation Increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the scale of pay.
 - b) Additional Increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the Scale of Pay, as per Board Rules.
 - c) Personal Pay, if any, granted to him as per Orders of the Board.
9. Basic pay shall not include any emoluments other than those specified above. The Special Pay, Charge Allowance etc., shall not count as pay for the purpose of calculation of Dearness Allowance.
10. The payment on account of Dearness Allowance involving fractions of 50 paise and above shall be rounded off

to the next Rupees and fractions of less than 50 paise shall be ignored.

11. The Dearness Allowance will be shown as a distinct element of remuneration and will not be treated as pay for any purpose.

PREAMBLE :

The grant of advance increments is regulated in Karnataka Electricity Board under the various Rules of KEBESRs (Rule 47 to 47 (g) originally issued under Board order referred above. From 1.3.1971 i.e. the effective date of Board order dated 8.4.71 (Reference (1) two advance increments were given to certain employees. This was subsequently increased to 4 advance increments with effect from 1.10.1974 to certain employees vide Board order (Reference 4.).

In Board order dated 5.9.75 which gave 4 advance increments with effect from 1.10.1974 stated that a candidate recruited as Junior Assistant/Typist in the minimum of time scale, who has acquired the qualification, prescribed in Col. 3 in the Table to the Board order, before the date of his appointment is entitled to 4 increments from the date of his joining the appointment. A Junior Assistant/Typist acquiring such qualification subsequent to his appointment is similarly entitled to 4 advance increments from the date of announcement of the results of the Examination concerned. This again become 2 advance increments to certain employees with effect from 1-4-1976 vide Board order of 25-10-1977 on revision of pay scales.

A question was raised before Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka whether the benefit of 4 advance increments to those who possessed or acquired higher qualification, on the date of or after the appointment continued to be available to such of those employees coming into Board service after 1-4-1976 but before 25-10-1977 (Reference 5). It is held by the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka that such benefit of 4 advance increments in the said manner will continue to such of those employees possessing or acquiring higher qualification as on or after 1.4.1976 but before

25.10 1977. But, the relief in the form of arrears of benefit to such employees were restricted by the Hon'ble Court in different writ petitions differently.

The issue has therefore been considered in its generality and the Board has resolved to make this ruling of the Hon'ble High Court applicable to all the employees appointed with higher qualification and placed in similar situation in terms of High Court order. Hence this Board order.

Board is pleased to accord approval ;

1. To grant 4 (four) advance increments to the Junior Assistants Typists and such other employees covered under Board order of 5.9.75 who possess, as on or acquire after, 1.4.1976 but before 25.10.1977 additional/higher qualification as prescribed in the said Board order dated of 5.9.1975.
2. To give fixation benefits taking into account the 4 (four) advance increments (less 2 (two) advance increments already sanctioned if any) and restrict the payment of arrears to actuals or to maximum of three years only whichever is less prior to the date of this Board order.
3. This benefit is available to only such of those employees who were in employment as on or before 25-10-1977 and who possessed or acquired higher/additional qualification as on or after 1-4-1976 but before 25-10-1977 and to whom the benefit of advance increments were available.

The Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order (Amendment) Ordinance, 1991 (No. 3 of 1991) promulgated by the President of India has come into force with effect from 19.4.1991. The same has been notified by the Government of Karnataka, in the State Gazette, vide Notification No. LAW 10 LCA 91 dated 8.5.91. As per the Ordinance, "In the Schedule to the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order, 1950, in Part VI-Karnataka in item 38, the following words shall be included at the end, namely :—

'Naik, Nayak, Beda, Bedar and Valmiki. Clarifications have been sought by some of the Deputy Commissioners and Tehsildars whether Scheduled Tribe certificates could be issued to these communities, viz., Naik, Nayak, Beda, Bedar and Valmiki.

It is hereby clarified that an ordinance has been issued classifying Naik, Nayak, Beda, Bedar and Valmiki communities under the Scheduled Tribes, by the Government of India with

effect from 19 4.91 throughout the State of Karnataka.

The jurisdictional Tahsildars, empowered to issue the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Certificates, should follow the instructions laid down in G.O No. SWL 213 SAD 85 dated 23.3.87 and issue Scheduled Tribe Certificates for the purpose of extending benefits under Article 15 (4) and 16 (4) of the constitution of India to the people belonging to Naik, Nayak, Beda, Bedar and Valmiki communities.

A large number of cases pertaining to store losses/shortages have been reported to Board, requesting for write-off the losses/ shortages. The Board has taken a very serious note of it and directs that the Divisional officers should exercise proper supervision over the Store transactions. Attention is drawn to the rules laid down in KEB Accounts Manual Vol. II relating to Stores wherein duties of the Divisional Executive Engineer, Store officer, Store keeper and Assistant Store keeper are clearly stipulated. Each official is expected to carry out his duties and responsibilities as assigned. Any lapses on the part of any official shall be reported immediately to the higher authorities and for any lapses or shortages, the responsibility of the officials shall be fixed jointly as per Codal Rules.

Though it is the direct responsibility of the Store keeper and Assistant Store keeper for store shortages, the Divisional Executive Engineer and Store officer shall also be held responsible on their part for dereliction of duty and abetting to such lapses.

CIRCULAR

Subject : Regarding theft of materials.

It is observed by the Board that a large number of cases regarding theft of Board materials like, copper wire, transformer coils, poles, line materials including live wire and cash have taken place in many parts of the State. Such cases may be at times, with the connivance of some of our own employees.

It is directed that all such cases should not only be reported immediately to the concerned jurisdictional Police Stations by lodging written complaints but also a copy of such complaint be sent to the Chief Vigilance Officer, Karnataka Electricity Board, Bangalore, who would follow up the matter with the Police Authorities. This does not imply that it is only the duty of the Chief Vigilance Officer to follow up such cases, but, the local officers should also take necessary follow up action with the District Authorities.

In cases wherein our employees are also suspected the same should be immediately reported to the Chief Vigilance Officer and marking a copy to the Board. All employees of the Board are requested to keep a strict watch with regard to the Board materials and ensure that such thefts should not occur due to our own laxity.

Sub : **Extension of liberalised pensionary benefits/Family Pension benefits-Implementation of the KAT's orders.**

G. O. No. FD (Spl.) 97, PET 87, Bangalore, Dated the 25.2.1989

In view of the Karnataka Administrative Tribunal's orders dated 30.9.87 and 29-3-1988 on the applications (509 of 87, 2668 of 86, 4551, 4727-28, 7208-43, 7524, 7913-15, 8021-22 and 9285 of 86 (T) filed by some individual pensioner and Pensioners Associations, which have been confirmed by the Supreme Court, Government are pleased to issue the following orders :

Pension :

2.1 A Government servant who retired from service prior to 1st January 1977 may, at his/her option, apply in the prescribed form (Annex-1 to this Government Order) for re-fixation of his/her pension, if such re-fixation is advantageous to the pensioner, in accordance with paras 1 (a) (i) and 2 (a) and (b) of G. O. No. FD Spl. 326 PET 76 dated 24.12.76. The pensioner will be eligible for the arrears of increase in pension for the period 1.1.1977 to 28.2.1980 or upto the date pension was drawn, whichever is earlier, subject to the condition stipulated in para 2.3 below.

2.2 A Government servant who retired from service prior to 29.2.1980 may, at his/her option, apply in the prescribed form

(Annexure-I to this Government order) for refixation of his her pension, if such refixation is advantageous to the pensioner, in accordance with G. O. No. FD (Spl.) 121 PET. 79 dt. 21.3.1980. The pensioner will be eligible for the arrears of increase in pension for the period 29.2.1980 to 31.3.1982 or upto the date pension was drawn whichever is earlier, subject to the condition stipulated in para 2.3 below.

2.3 The increase in pension allowed with effect from January 1977 in accordance with para 5 of G. O. No. FD (Spl.) 320 CET 76, dated 24.12.1976 and ad-hoc relief allowed with effect from 1.3.1980 in accordance with G. O. No. FD (Spl.) 133 pET 79, dated 18.3.1980 will be deducted from the increase in pension resulting from the revision of pension in pursuance of paras 2.1 and 2.2 above.

2.4 No. commutation will be admissible for the additional amount of pension accruing as a result of this revision.

2.5 These benefits will not affect the DCRG already determined.

Family pension :

3.1 The family of a Government servant who died while in service before 1.1.1982 or who retired from service prior to 1.1.1982 and died subsequently, may at its option, apply in the prescribed form (Annexure-II to this Government Order) for refixation of family pension, if such refixation is advantageous, in accordance with para 4.2 of G. O. No. FD 94 SRP (CSC) 82 dated 29.3.1982. The recipient of the family pension will be eligible for the arrears of increase in family pension from 1.4.1982 or from the date of drawal of family pension whichever is later up to 18.7.1985 or up to the date up to which the family pension was drawn, whichever is earlier. The arrears payable is subject to the condition stipulated in para 3.4 below.

3.2 The family of a Government servant who died while in service before 19.7.1985 or retired from service prior to 19.7.1985 and died subsequently, may at its option, apply in the prescribed form (Annexure-II to this Government Order) for re-fixation of family pension, if such re-fixation is advantageous, in accordance with para 4(2) of G. O. No. FD 18 SRS 86 dated 24.6.1986. The recipient of the family pension will be eligible for the arrears of increase in family pension from 19.7.1985 upto 30.6.1987 or up to the date upto which the family pension was drawn, whichever is earlier.

3.3 The family of a Government servant who dies while in service before 1.7.1986 or who retired from service before 1.7.1986 and died subsequently may at its option, apply in the prescribed form (Annexure-II to this Government Order) for re-fixation of family pension, if such re-fixation is advantageous in accordance with para 5.1 of G. O. No. FD 20 SRS 87 (1) dated 17.8.1987. The recipient of the family pension will be eligible for the arrears of increase in family pension for the period 1.7.1987 upto 28.2.1989 or upto the date upto which the family pension was drawn, whichever is earlier.

3.4 The increase in family pension allowed with effect from 1.1.1977 in accordance with G. O. No. FD (Spl.) 326 PET 76 dated 24.12.1976 will be deducted from their increase in family pension in pursuance of para 3.1 above.

4. The other conditions stipulated from time to time for regulating pension and family pension will continue to apply.

5.1 The details about the liberalisation of pension rules introduced from 1.1.1977 and 29.2.1980 and revision of the rates of family pension made from 1.4.1982, 19.7.1985 and 1.7.1987 are given in Annex-III to this Government Order.

5.2 The increase in pension in accordance with this order will be calculated on the basis of the difference between the existing pension as on the date (s) of the revision and the revised pension. For the purpose of this order, the existing pension includes dearness allowance merged in the pension with effect from 1-1-1977.

5.3 Similarly, the increase in family pension in accordance with this order will be calculated on the basis of the difference between the existing family pension as on the date (s) of the revision and the revised family pension. For the purpose of this order, the existing family pension includes dearness allowance merged in the family pension with effect from 1-1-1977, 1-4-1982, 1-8-1985 and 1-1-1987 and also the increase sanctioned with effect from 1-7-1987.

5.4 A Government servant who retired from service prior to 1.1.1977 and 29.2.1980 and recipients of family pension may, at their option, apply in the prescribed form (induplicate) for refixation of pension/family pension in accordance with this order and forward it to the Accountant General, Karnataka, Bangalore, through the Special Officer (Pension), Finance Department, Room No: 714, VII Floor, III Stage, Multi-storeyed Buildings, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Veedhi, Bangalore-560 001, within six months from the date of issue of this order.

5.5 In cases where the pensioner referred to in para 2.1 was alive on 1.1.1977 and died subsequently, his/her legal heir (s) may apply in the prescribed form for revision of pension with effect from 1.1.1977. The legal heir (s) will be eligible for the arrears from 1.1.1977 to 28.2.1980 or till the date of the pensioners death, whichever is earlier.

5.6 Similarly, in cases where the pensioner referred to in para 2.2 was alive on 29.2.1980 and died subsequently, his/her legal heir (s) may also apply in the prescribed form for revision of pension with effect from 29.2.1980. The legal heir (s) will be eligible for the arrears from 29.2.1980 to 31.3.1982 or till the date of the pensioner's death, whichever is earlier.

6.1 Government have carefully examined the direction given by the Karnataka Administrative Tribunal to consider whether any modification to G.O. No. FD (Spl.) 5 PET 86 dated 20.3.1986 is necessary and if so, to make such modification. The pensioners had made a prayer before the Tribunal to extend the benefit of pension at 50 percent of the pay last drawn for 30 years service instead of 33 years service.

6.2 Prior to 1.12.1985, pension was equal to 50 percent of average emoluments of preceding 10 months. This was revised with effect from 1.12.1985. Under the revised formula, pension is calculated at 50 percent of pay last drawn at the time of retirement. Full pension is admissible to an employee on completion of 33 years service. The definition of the term 'emoluments' has also been modified. (Special pay, charge allowance, personal pay; etc.,) which were earlier taken into account for calculation of pension have now been excluded. The benefit of the liberalised pension formula has also been extended to the past pensioners (Government servants retired from service prior to 1.12.1985) in accordance with the principles laid down in the Nakura's case.

6.3 The revised pension formula introduced from 1-12-1985 has both liberalised and deliberalised features. It is a package deal. A Government servant who retires from service on or after 1-12-1985 is eligible for the benefit of full pension for 33 years service. No distinction is made between a person retired from services prior to 1-12-1985 and on or after 1-12-1985. The past pensioners have been given option either to get their pension

Sub : Disposal of Revenue appeal petitions by the Appellate Authorities of the Board Reg.

In Board Circulars of even-number dated 25-10-90 and 29-12-90 on the captioned subject, it had been emphasised among other things, that whenever the Appellate Authorities of the Board take up the Revenue Appeal cases for disposal, they shall invariably :

- (i) insist upon the appellants to pay 50% of the amount in dispute relating to the cases of theft of electrical energy and 25% of the claims in all other cases, before hearing the appeals.
- (ii) dispose off the appeal cases expeditiously, keeping in view all the relevant regulations in force from time to time.
- (iii) send copies of the appeal orders going against the Board to the concerned officers immediately and in respect of theft and un-authorized load cases booked by the staff of Vigilance Squad/TAC, copies of the appeal orders be sent to them independently.
- (iv) hear the evidence of the O & M Officers/officials of the Board as also of the staff from the Vigilance Squad/TAC, before finalising the appeal petitions etc.

In spite of clear guidelines having been issued in the above matter, it has come to the notice of the Board that some of the Board that some of the Appellate Authorities are found to be deviating from the Regulations/Circular instructions in this behalf while disposing off the revenue appeal cases, which has been viewed very seriously by the Board.

Therefore, it is once again directed that, while disposing off the Revenue appeal cases of the consumers, the Appellate Authorities shall not only follow the Regulations framed by the Board from time to time and circular instructions given in this behalf, but also shall call the concerned staff from the Vigilance Squad/TAC, take their Views/Opinion/evidence in connection with all the cases of theft of energy/unauthorised load booked by them and then Decide depending upon the merits of each case.

The instructions contained in this circular shall be scrupulously followed in future.
